It is. We'll meet once a month: we will run **monthly in-person seminars** discussing a paper related to open science or metascience. The next Warwick University ReproducibiliTea journal club session will take place on Thursday 25th April at 3pm in room A1.50 (Gibbet Hill Campus). It will be facilitated by Lucas Castillo (Psychology). Lucas will present a recent preprint he has read on using large language models to aid rewriting and revising scientific text. The authors propose that this could speed up scientific work; the topic, however, is controversial, with different journals having adopted at the moment <u>different policies</u> with regard to Algenerated content. Of course, the memory of the recent catastrophe at Frontiers is still fresh: they had a paper published (now retracted) with Al-generated, non-sensical images (you can see how it was at <u>archive.org</u>).
