

Changes in the Finance Office Portfolios

From the Finance Office: Following the retirement of two Deputy Finance Directors, Andrew Smith in July and Debbie Jay at the end of September, Finance Office portfolios have been reorganised. Deputy Finance Director Sam McClenaghan is moving to the Group Accounting portfolio and CFO Helen Mead will take on the Departmental Services Team (DST) and ARC portfolios for the Faculties of Social Science and Arts as well as the Professional Services portfolio and a coordination role. A CFO post to cover the DST work for the Faculty of Science is currently being advertised. This reflects the increasing Finance Office workload relating to academic departments and a desire to improve the service to departments and to consolidate Finance Office academic department work in a way that simplifies our offer to departments. UKVI Mock Audit - reminder of deadline for key contacts by 19 July

From Student Immigration: as you will be aware, Warwick was last audited by the Home Office UKVI in February 2020 which means it has been more than four years since our last audit. The UKVI has since substantially expanded their 'Student Visiting' audit team and are quite active in their audits. The notice period for an audit is also relatively short (at a maximum of 3 weeks). A full audit usually lasts 2-3 days, intense interviews with key personnel and a separate team conducting file audits. To test processes and compliance and to be better prepared, we have organised for a Mock UKVI Audit to be conducted by Eversheds-Sutherland (a law firm). The mock audit will occur on Tuesday 30 and Wednesday 31 July with a two week notice period and an expected duration of two days. As per the attached memo sent by Adam on 23 May 2024, please could you submit a <u>UKVI Audit Key Contact Form</u> for your department. *We would be grateful if you could submit the form by Friday 19 July 2024.* Thank you.

Call for Applications: Christmas Lectures 2024

The annual award-winning Warwick Christmas Lectures aim to inspire and engage the next generation of scientists. Running for over 10 years, this is a key event in our festive calendar in engaging our community. We want to break down the barriers to science by making Warwick's cutting-edge research accessible and engaging to a family audience. Each Lecture is up to 20-minutes and can be:

- Science/science related themes that are engaging and interesting.
- Exciting experiments and/or demonstrations that have a visual impact.
- Language that explains things clearly to those as young as 8 years old, but also engages the adults in the audience, and all the ages in between!
- Enthusiasm and passion for your subject
- A willingness to work with the Christmas Lecture team to shape your material
- Opportunities for the audience to be called on stage to volunteer or to participate from their seats. One experiment should ideally include the whole audience.
 - If you are staff, ways to get your students involved in the planning or delivery of the lecture.
 - A festive connection is desirable but not essential.
 - You can be a PhD student, academic, technician, or any other science-related role.

You must be available for three rehearsal dates (Monday 4, 11 and 18 November in the evening), and one performance date (Monday 25 November and Monday 2 December in the evening). Once selected, you will work with the Warwick Christmas Lectures team who will support you with accessibility for younger

audiences and making your contribution ready for the stage of the Butterworth Hall. Outlines should fill no more than one side of A4 paper and successful applicants will be invited to a meeting where we ask you to present part of your proposal. Please include your confirmation of availability of the rehearsal and performance dates given above. <u>Participatory Research Fund:</u> Internal grants of up to £25k to be spent by 30/06/25 (subject to confirmation of funding from Research England)

Internal grants of up to £25k are available for research projects that can fully spend by 30 June 2025, delivered in conjunction with external organisations, with bids on a short application form invited by Friday 6th September 2025 to <u>Research_Impact@warwick.ac.uk.</u>

Eligible projects should be focussed on co-produced research and to run capacity-building activities such as:

- Pilot projects using innovative models and methodologies for participatory research
- The development of materials to support researchers interested in developing their skills in participatory research, and public engagement activities that are related to participatory and co-produced research
- Case studies and evidence of the impact of co-produced research, and evaluations of the effectiveness of co-production from different institutions/disciplines.

The Participatory Research Fund must be fully spent by 30th June 2025. However, applicants are invited to indicate where projects could be extended beyond that date, such that a pipeline of potential future projects can be established in the area of "participatory research". Funding in excess of £25k is available for transformational projects with a demonstrable ability to fully spend within the funding period, but these should be discussed in advance with the R&IS Impact Team, who are also available to provide general advice and guidance on this call.
