I am a zoologist and ethologist, and I completed my PhD at the University of Parma (Italy) working on physiological correlates of emotions in dogs, assessed with remote and non-remote methods. I work mainly, but not only, with pet and wild (wolves and jackals) Canids. Here, I work at the ApeTank with Adriano Reis e Lameira and I will try to develop a method to assess remotely various physiological parameters in captive great apes during vocalization.

## Wider sector news

The BBC reports that US president Joe Biden <u>has cancelled \$1.2 billion (£950 million) in student</u> loans, IT systems are down at the University of Wolverhampton, and thieves have <u>stripped lead from</u> <u>a University of Bradford building</u>. In The Guardian, academics <u>have won a claim against the University of Oxford over 'sham contracts'</u>, GCSE grades are said to be <u>a good predictor of life chances and wellbeing</u>, the University of Florida's student senate <u>has passed a 'green new deal'</u>, and there's a podcast on <u>why so many science papers</u> <u>are being retracted</u>.

The Financial Times covers a warning from a cancer charity that the UK <u>risks missing out on a golden</u> age of drug discovery.

The Telegraph says that the UK's first estate agency degree <u>costs £9,250 a year and some lectures</u> will be online, and British students are being <u>'forced to overpay on rent as landlords prioritise wealthy</u> foreigners'.

In The Herald, students are to protest outside the Scottish parliament over education cuts.
