THE latest gaming technology is being used by students in Coventry in their bid to create a winning robot.

Warwick University engineering students are working on using the Xbox to help navigate an innovative rescue robot.

They are currently testing the Xbox Kinect to see if they can use it to move the autonomous robot in an effort to retain the European RoboCup

Rescue Championship title they won in Germany last May.

The team is being backed by academic Dr Emma Rushforth who believes the project will give the students an excellent opportunity to showcase their skills.
