English Medium Instruction Programme (EMI)

This teacher development programme is designed to support, develop and enhance the knowledge and skills of university lecturers who teach on international EMI programmes. It is delivered by teacher trainers who are experienced in working with EMI lecturers in a wide range of education contexts around the world, have an understanding of the challenges EMI lecturers face, and are able to offer ideas and practical solutions for the EMI classroom.

Participants

The programme is for university lecturers who:

- ▶ work in all academic disciplines
- ▶ are required to teach academic subjects in English
- ▶ have an English language level of at least B2 CEFR

By the end of the course participants will have:

- ▶ developed an understanding of teaching and learning theories relevant to EMI
- ▶ experienced and considered the application of a range of EMI teaching techniques and activities
- ▶ prepared and delivered a short Micro Teaching activity which demonstrates EMI pedagogy
- ▶ researched and presented an Action Research proposal in an area of personal relevance
- ▶ developed ideas for building a community of practice in their home institution

Programme details

Course content

The course is organised into the following strands

- ▶ EMI pedagogy
- ▶ English language for EMI
- ▶ Action Research
- ▶ Micro teaching



The teacher trainers

- ▶ Experienced in working with EMI lecturers in a wide range of education contexts around the world
- ▶ Have an understanding of the challenges the EMI lecturers face
- ▶ Able to offer ideas and practical solutions to the challenges of EMI

Mode of delivery

- ▶ Small class sizes that allow participants to interact, discuss and work closely with the teacher-trainer
- ▶ Use of loop learning where participants experience EMI pedagogy first-hand
- ▶ Input sessions that utilise EMI pedagogy, followed by interactive activities that allow participants to unpack key concepts, theories and approaches
- ▶ Mini-lectures followed by small-group-discussion that allows participants to relate methodology to their own teaching contexts
- ▶ Post-class follow-up and supplementary tasks hosted on the learning platform
- ▶ Action research projects that give participants the opportunity to explore EMI teaching and learning issues in depth

INCLUDED IN THE PROGRAMME:

- ▶ Accommodation - Participants stay in student accommodation on campus or in homestay with experienced hosts who are located a short bus ride from campus
- ▶ Cultural trips such as Warwick Castle, Shakespeare's Stratford, Oxford or London
- ▶ A welcome and farewell group buffet lunch in the Conference Suite with the teaching staff
- ▶ Airport pickups and a bus pass to enable travel to and from campus and exploration of the local area
