Technical Content



- Core modules in particular (Micro, Macro and Metrics) are quite technical.
- If necessary:
 - Check out first year UG Quantitative Methods notes
 - Can find many on other uni websites and on youtube
 - Talk to your class tutors.

Assessments and Examination



- Most 30 CATS modules:
 - Combination of end of the year exam 80% and internal assessment (20%)
- Different for Econometrics and some quantitative modules
- Modules from other departments have their own assessment methods
- Exam Board meets in the first week of July.

Assessment Criteria



TO PASS THE DIPLOMA

Pass (>40%) at least 90 CATS and;

An average mark of 40% or better over 120 CATS.

TO PASS THE DIPLOMA AND PROCEED TO THE MASTERS

Pass (>40%) at least 90 CATS and;

An average of 58% or better in 120 CATS and;

A mark of 60% or better on at least 60 CATS.

RESIT MARKS ARE CAPPED AT 40%

Pastoral Support



Everyone is allocated a **Personal tutor**
