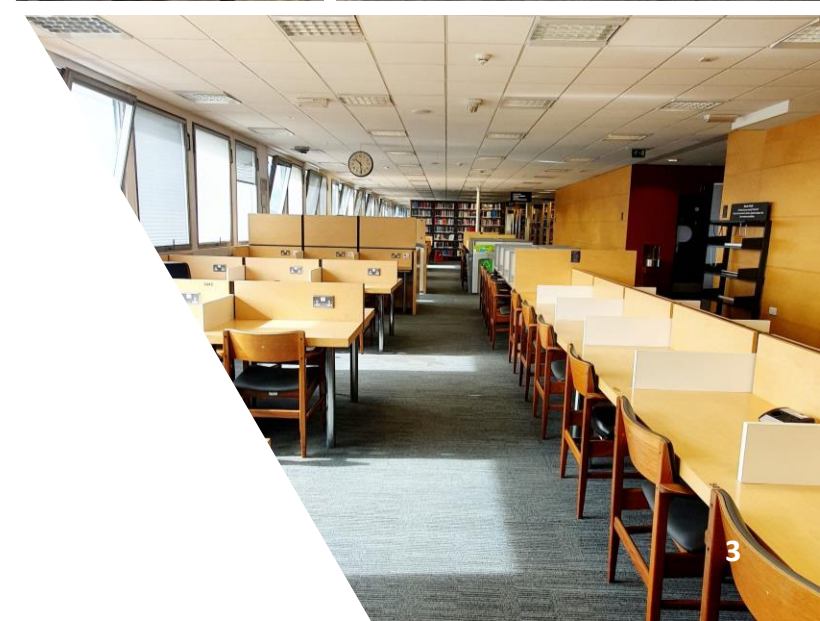
Study spaces

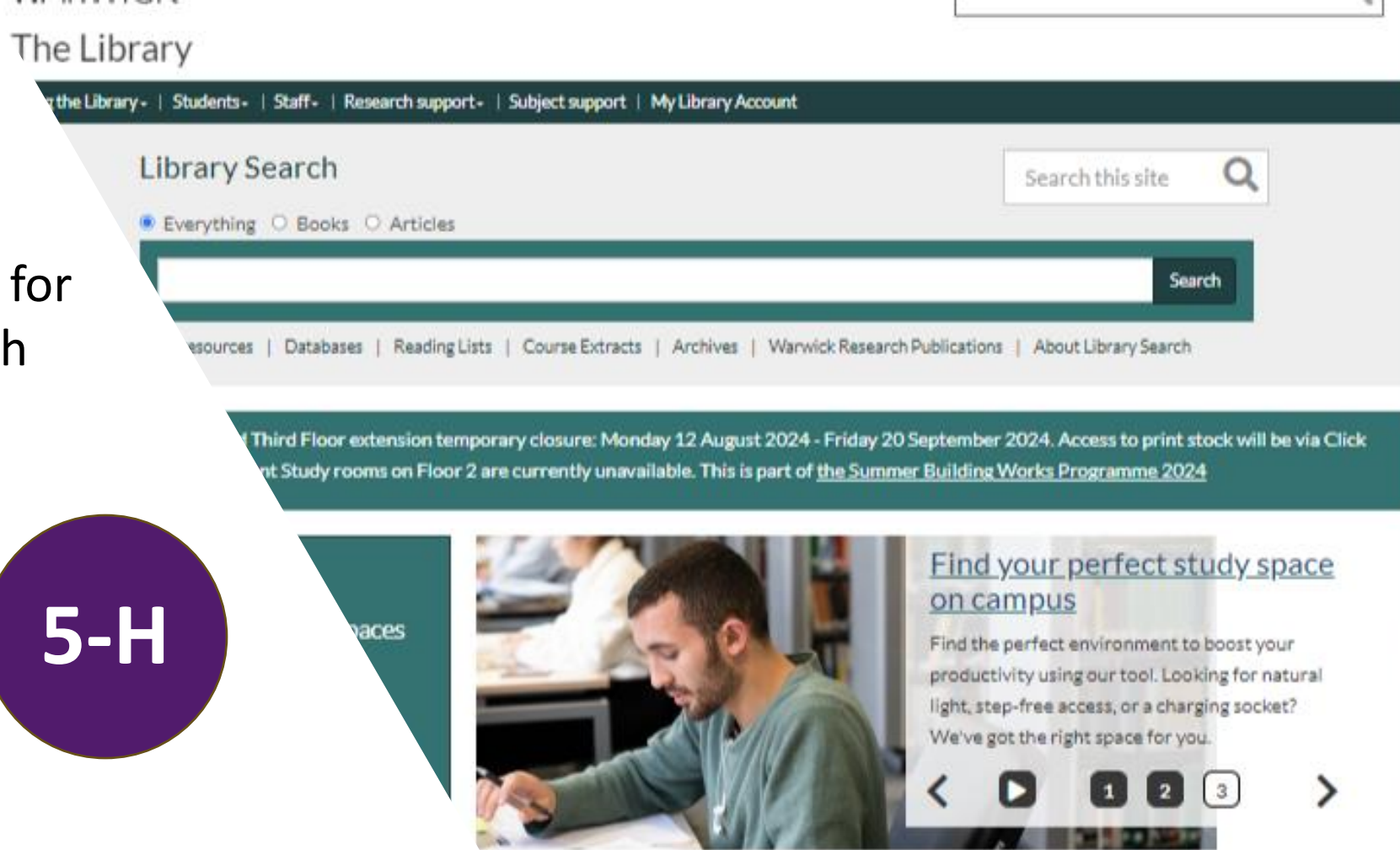
Library resources

Economics books are located on 5th floor of library in classmark H



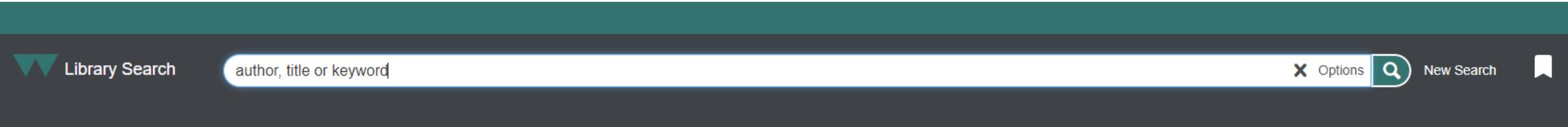
- Most modules have an online reading list

- Reading List available via Moodle or Library website
- Search for your reading list by module code or title
- Login to mark your reading status and add own notes

- **Library Search** is the library's search engine or discovery service
- Find books/chapters, journals/articles, databases and more
- Search by author, title or keyword. Limit results by subject, date, resource type
- Access **library account**: view and renew items on-loan
- **Recall & reserve** on-loan items and request **click & collect**

Print books

Library Search will tell you copies, classmark and availability **(5-H)**

- Unlimited borrowing (999 copies)
- 1 year loan period (unless recalled)

If all copies of book are on-loan, request book using **Click & Collect**

Ebooks

- **Library Search** = Full-Text Online
- **Login** to ebooks with University IT user number and password

Restrictions on use of ebooks:

- **Copies:** single, multiple, unlimited users
- **Printing:** 10% pages, 1 chapter, unlimited
- **Download:** read online only, download chapters as PDFs, download to ereader

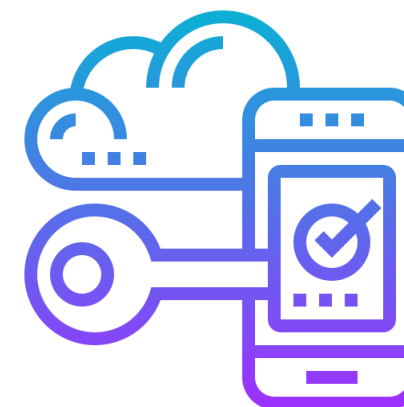
You will be prompted to login with your IT user number and password

Document supply

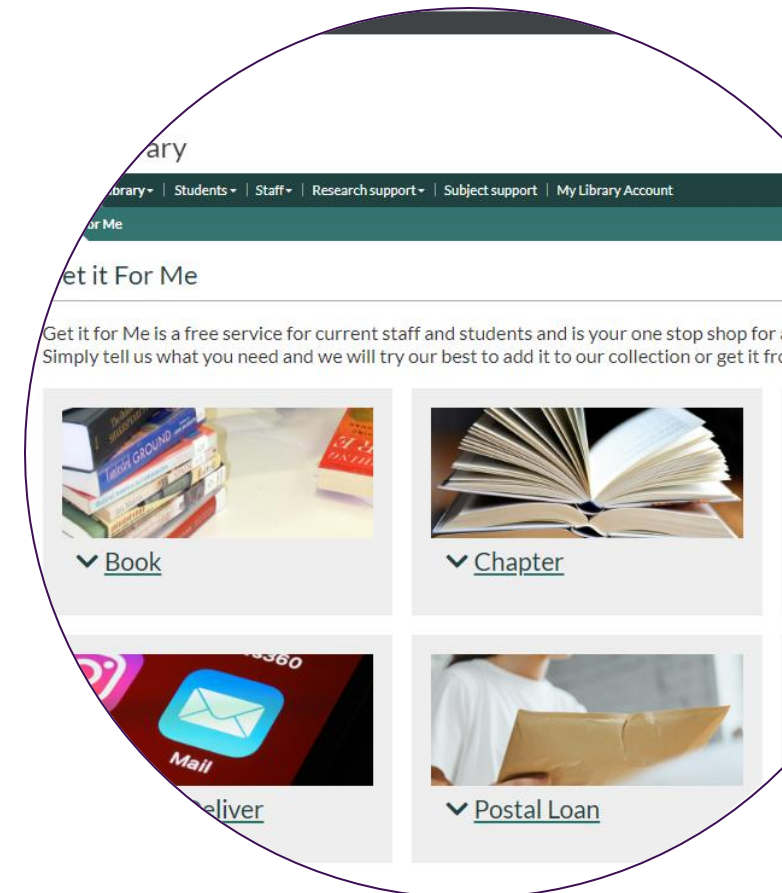

Get It For Me is the library's document supply service

Access to books, chapters and articles not available in the library:

- **Book Suggestion:** ask us to buy a book for the library
- **Inter-Library Loan:** borrow a book from another library
- **Digitisation:** of articles and chapters from another library

You can also request **postal loan** of print books held in our library

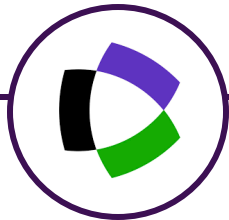


