





Library resources which people often miss – log on through the Library website for full access

- **Centre for Economic Policy Research** – register free of charge to access the website off-campus
- **Global Financial Data**
- **NBER Working Papers**
- **OECD iLibrary** – log on for full access to data and reports to download.
- **Roper i-Library** – mainly US opinion poll data
- **Statista** – market research and industry reports and data
- **UN iLibrary** - log on for full access to data and reports to download.

- Datastream
- Eikon
- Both provide global company and stock exchange data; Eikon also provides data and news on mergers and acquisitions
- Available on a dedicated PC on Floor 1 of the Library

Hidden gems not available through the Library



- **Bloomberg** – available at one dedicated PC in the Economics Department
- **Wharton Research Data Service (WRDS)** – Economics staff and PhD students can register via the WRDS website





We can obtain journal articles from other libraries free of charge

- Articles can be scanned and e-mailed to you in 3 working days via [Article Reach](#).
- Try this scheme first as it does not affect your Department's quota!
- If that fails **Document Supply** is more comprehensive
- If lockdown restrictions are lifted, we could also borrow a book from another library for you through Document Supply – scheme currently suspended
- Check the Library website for updates

New subscriptions to databases – caveats...

- We can only take out a new subscription if academic staff agree to cancel something else
- Expensive databases may be impossible to obtain at present
- Even if approval is granted, it can take a very long time to set up a new subscription...
- **BUT** we can sometimes gain a new resource
- Discuss the issue with your supervisor and contact me
- There may be an alternative source for the data which you seek



Finding PhD theses

- Recent Warwick theses are mostly available online in **WRAP – Warwick Research Archive Portal**
- Find UK and Irish online theses via **EThOS – Electronic Theses Online Delivery Service**
- Find details of theses more widely in **Dissertations and Theses**
- **Warwick theses** are held in print in the [Modern Records Centre](#) – find the reference number using “Library Search”, then consult and photocopy it as you wish
- All UK theses are held in the British Library and at the university where they were written
- The Library can buy US and Canadian theses to add to stock - this can take over one month
