What are the Aims of the Scheme?



To enhance the student experience for all involved.

To help integration between students in different years and from different countries — shared experiences.

- To provide opportunities for second and third years to enhance their skills and CVs.
- To help you settle in and navigate the first year.



How will it work?

- ► Groups of around 10-11 first year students will be allocated 2 mentors from the 2nd and 3rd years.
- ► Where possible we will try to match mentors by course
- ► Inga Turner (Student Support and Progression Officer) organises the mentor scheme





How will it work?





- ► Mentors will be informed of your details and will be in touch via email to arrange your first meeting for week 3
- Please check your Warwick email daily.

Meetings

- Meetings between mentors and mentees will be a mix of social, information and guidance, and signposting activities.
- Each meeting will last one hour (or longer if required).
- Meetings should take place Monday Friday preferably in the early evening to avoid clashes with the teaching timetable.
- You will need to attend at least 3 meetings to gain PDM credits.


