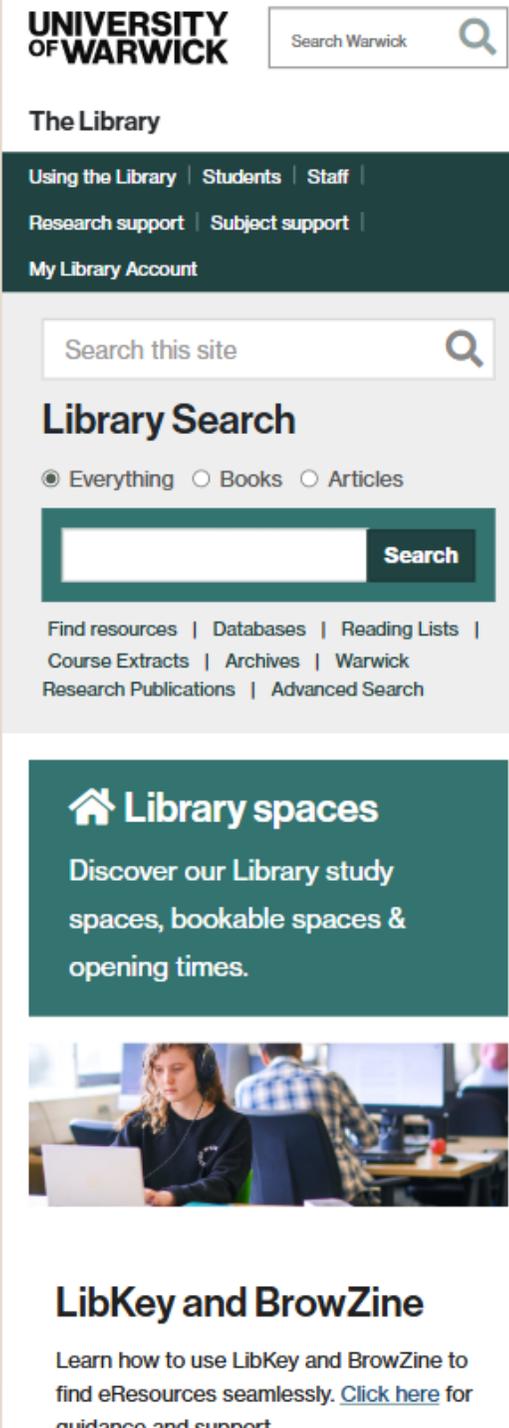



Library Search finds articles, books, chapter, databases and more

- Search by author/title for known items, or keyword for items on a topic
- Limit search results by resource type, subject and publication data
- *Quick Look* to view a summary; *Full-Text Online* to access digital library
- Export search results: *Save*, *Email* and *Cite this item*

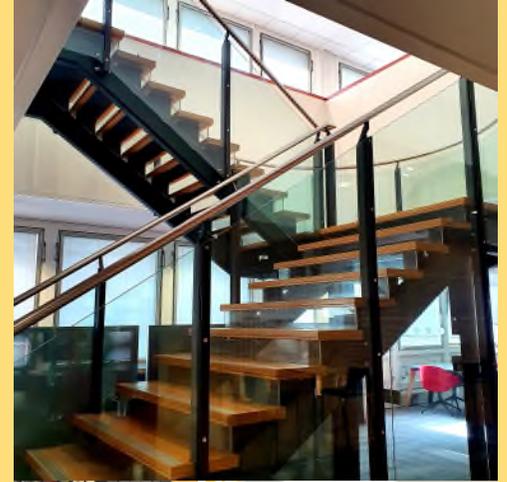

Book collections

Economics books located on 5th floor in H class mark

- Self-issue machines on 1st floor of library
- University ID card required to borrow books
- Unlimited borrowing (999 items)
- 1 year loan period (unless recalled)
- Click & Collect + Postal Loans services

If all copies of a library book are on-loan, recall a copy using the Click & Collect service on Library Search

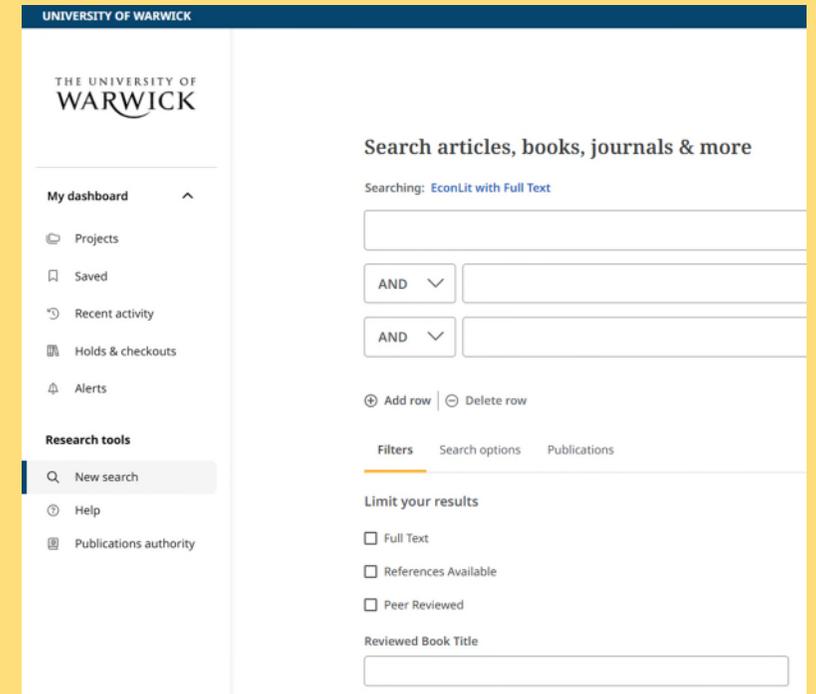

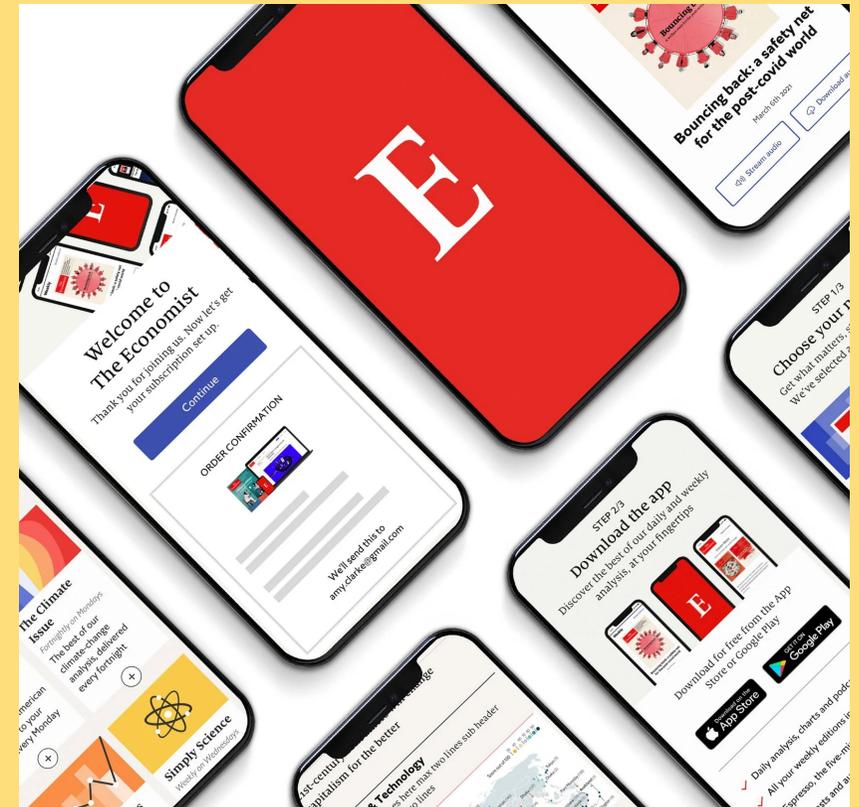

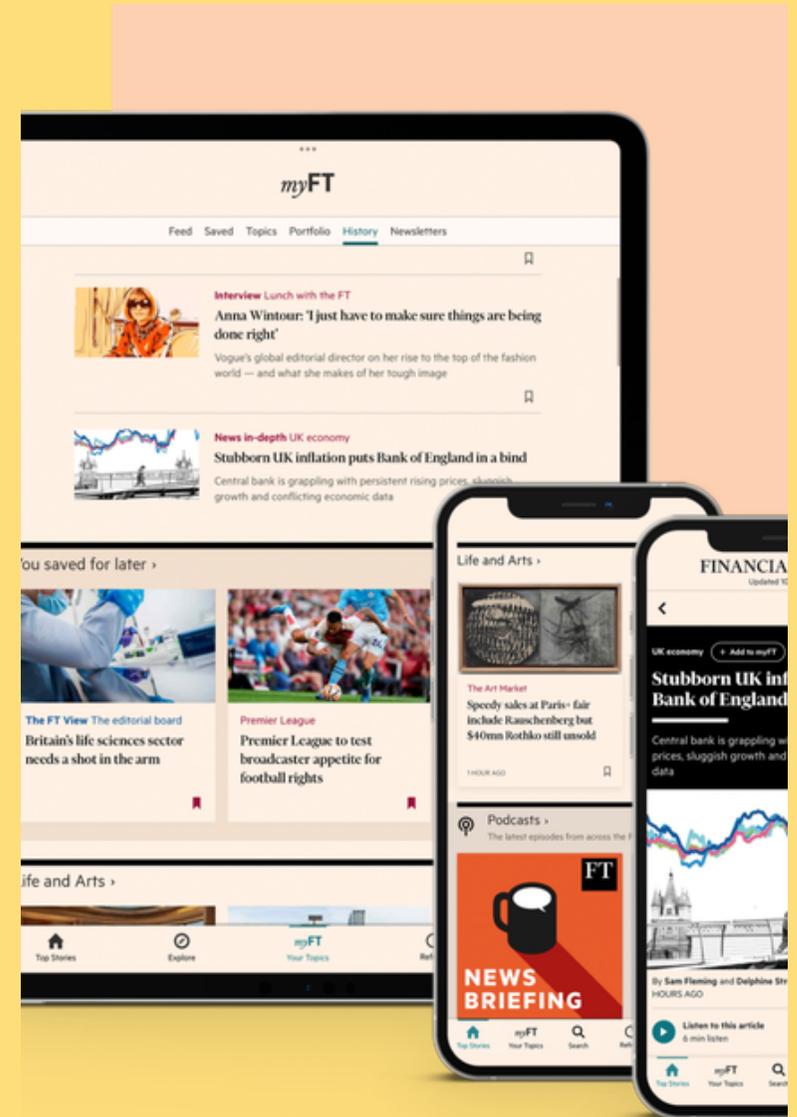
