This event is an opportunity to explore and ask questions about the types of work and projects you would be involved in by the employers attending, which should give you a good feel for what's involved.

Essential Event Preparation

Please find below some suggested learning outcomes organised by year group to help you get the most from this event.

First Years

This is an opportunity to:

- Identify how to create a good first impression
- Practice initiating a conversation with an employer and building a relationship
- Learn about careers in economics and what areas you may be more interested in pursuing
- Learn about internship opportunities

Questions you could ask:

- Are there any particular skills you should develop early on in your degree if you want to work as an Economist or in an
 economics-related role?
- What modules would you recommend studying to go into this career path?
- What types of technology/IT programmes do you use on a daily basis in your role?

Second Years

Try to do some research in advance into the organisations which interest you. Can you find reports or case studies on their websites which you could read and discuss with representatives attending on the day?

- Explore how organisations recruit to their roles
- Learn about internship opportunities

Questions you could ask:

- Which types of modules could I take in my final year which would be beneficial?
- Is taking a masters degree essential if I want to work for you?
