- 2. An up-to-date c.v., no more than 2 pages. We need a consistent house style. Please use the template overleaf. These c.v.s will be uploaded as separate attachments on the Joint Electronic Submission (Je-S) system.

As a consortium operating under the NDA programme, we need to provide evidence of:

- 1. multi-disciplinarity and successful collaborations
- 2. established partnerships with industry, policy etc
- 3. the involvement of end-users
- 4. ground-breaking methodologies
- 5. impact on the policy-making process and the quality of working lives
- 6. systems & processes which will create a new generation of inter-disciplinary researchers
- 7. Links with researchers in the EU, North America and other countries
- 8. value for money, exemplary quality thresholds and the highest ethical standards
