Dear Student

The Examination Boards and Mitigating Circumstances Panels are fast approaching. A final reminder, all MC claims must be submitted by the dates below to be considered. Mitigating Circumstances applications that are submitted after the deadlines will only be considered in exceptional circumstances, with evidence of why the application could not be submitted by the deadline.

- Finalists – Friday 19th June 2026 at 12 noon
- 1st Years – Monday 22nd June 2026 at 12 noon
- Intermediate Years – 3 July at 12 noon
- Law and Sociology Students – Friday 19th June at 12 noon

The rest of this update relates to **Results Days** and explains what will happen on the day itself. This year's **Results days** are below.

- **Finalists – Thursday 9 July 2026**
- **First years – Thursday 16 July 2026**
- **Intermediates – Thursday 23 July 2026**

You will receive notification of your results via the Tabula system. Your HEAR transcript will also be available on these dates. If you need guidance with accessing your HEAR, please contact Student Administrative Services ([HEAR and Transcripts Team](#)). Please note that feedback for all assessments submitted via Tabula, and for examinations completed through WAS, will be released on Thursday 23rd July 2026.

FAILS AND RESITS

We appreciate this is a really anxious time for any student not receiving the results they had hoped for. Remember that you have an automatic right to remedy failure for each module on one occasion and a disappointing result is most likely to be a setback rather than a disaster. If you are in this position, you will receive your formal notification from

the University first and shortly afterwards, a formal communication from the Law School usually emailed on the day after results release. In this letter you will receive details of your results, and, in the case of written assessments, you will receive a copy of the re-sit assessment. If you have not received this within 24 hours of your result, please get in touch with undergraduate.law@warwick.ac.uk and we will investigate.

If you are upset by your results, feel free to get in touch to talk things through. If your personal tutor is not around, please email us at law.dugs@warwick.ac.uk and we will either contact you directly or put you in touch with someone who can help with your query. You can also contact [Wellbeing services](#) if you wish to talk to someone outside of the Law School.

Our overarching message if your results are not as expected is **don't panic**. Take a deep breath and get in touch if you need to.

APPEALS

For finalists, information on the rights to appeal against your degree results are set out in [Regulation 42](#). Grounds are limited to cases of procedural irregularity, prejudice or bias on the part of the examiners, or that you are in possession of evidence relevant to your assessment performance which was not available to the Board of Examiners previously.

(Reg 42.2). Appeals are directed to the University and not to the Law School, so we are unable to assist you should you wish to appeal. You can, however, discuss with your Personal Tutor.

PASSES AND PRIZES

Results are released formally by the University in the morning on the designated date.

Prizes are awarded to:

- All years: Top performer in each degree in each year.
- Finalists only: Best supervised project in each stream
- Firsts years only: Slaughter and May prize for Best Overall Performance
- Intermediate years only: Slaughter and May prize for Best Performance in Contract Law, and the Feldon Dunsmore Prize for Best Performance in Property Law.
- CIOT Prize for Best Performance in Corporate Tax Law

We will schedule communications on prizes for the afternoon of the results release, so if you are very pleased with your result look out for further emails to tell you whether you are top of the class. Prizes for Finalists will be presented by Professor Andrew Williams, the Head of the Law School, at the pre-Graduation Law School Reception.
