If you are travelling outside of the UK during this Christmas period, make sure you register for your e-Visa now to avoid unnecessary difficulties when returning to the UK. If you have already registered for your e-Visa, make sure you add your current passport to your UKVI account as this is how airlines and immigration officials check your visa status.

**4. Permission to change Term 2 modules.**

There is a limited opportunity to change your Term 2 option choices, for good reasons only, in Weeks 1 & 2 of next term. You must email the PG office with your request setting out clearly the modules you wish to change, copying in your course director and setting out the reasons for your request. These reasons will be assessed together with the module availability and the consent of your course director. You must wait until January 6, 2025, to make your request and last date to submit your request is 17 January 2025.
