Full-Time Students

If you are a full-time student, you will need to select six taught modules, three in Term 1 and three in Term 2 as well as <u>LA984</u>: <u>Dissertation</u>, <u>Research and Writing Module</u>.

On the LLM for International Commercial Law you will need the following:

Compulsory Core Modules

You Core Modules are <u>LA9FN: Foundations of International Commercial Law</u> and <u>LA984:</u> <u>Dissertation, Research and Writing Module.</u>

Part-Time Students

If you are studying part-time Year 1, please select four taught modules, two in Term 1 (one of which will be <u>LA9FN</u>: Foundations of International Commercial Law) and two options in Term 2.

If you are studying part-time Year 2, please choose your remaining optional modules and <u>LA984</u>: <u>Dissertation, Research and Writing Module</u>. For example, if you took 4 modules in your first year you will need to select 2 further optional modules and your dissertation module for this year. You must take a total of 120 CATS of taught modules. Your dissertation module is worth 60 CATS.

Core Module

You must take <u>LA9FN: Foundations of International Commercial Law</u> in your first year of study.

Dissertation Module

You will be formally registered for <u>LA984</u>: <u>Dissertation</u>, <u>Research and Writing Module</u> in Year 2 of your studies but you will find it very helpful to attend the taught classes in your first year as they will be helping to develop your research and essay writing skills. If this will be difficult for you, please contact your programme director (Dr Velimir Zivkovic) or the module convenor for LA984 (Mohsen Al Attar).

Changing Modules

We will ask you to make your module choices for both Term 1 and Term 2 by the end of Week 0. When the module timetable for Term 2 is confirmed later in Term 1, you may have a further opportunity to request any changes to your original options for Term 2.
