# Module registration

- By now you should have e-mailed your module choices to paisug@warwick.ac.uk
- If not, you will need to let them know your preferred modules The PAIS Team will register you on eMR
- Choose seminars via <u>Tabula</u> from Monday

# Module registration

- The norm in PAIS is 4 modules per term 60 CATS (Warwick Credits) – Full Year 120 CATS
- Year-long modules = 30 CATS
- ► Term-long modules = 15 CATS
- 30 CATS modules available as 15 CATS variants for Part Year students
- At least 50% of modules should be in PAIS
- Contact other departments if wishing to do modules with them

## Support through the process

- For academic advice please contact me or your personal tutor

#### **Lectures and seminars**

- PAIS lectures start in Week 1
- ▶ PAIS seminars normally start in Week 2 but may be some intro meetings in Week 1
- Seminars will open for sign up from Monday onwards
- Lots of emphasis on independent learning

#### **Assessment**

- Full year students are assessed in the same way of local students.
- For other students:
  - ONE x 1500 word essay for each 15 CATS module, due in Week 10 for Autumn term modules and Week 20 for Spring term modules.
  - TWO x 1500 word essays for each 30 CATS module, due in Weeks 10 and 20.

#### Assessment

Please see the PAIS UG Handbook on the PAIS UG Portal for the full details on module registration and assessment

- Be careful how many essays you choose to write: 4 x 30 CATS modules
  - @ 2 essays = 12,000 words

#### **Personal Tutors**

- First point of contact with regard to all general academic matters
- Or if you are experiencing any academic or personal difficulties for which you want advice and guidance.
- Personal Tutors can act as your referee in future
- At least one meeting per term name of your personal tutor on Tabula
- Or contact the UG office, or me, or Study Abroad in University House
