[Article Reach](#) is a free service which enables current staff and students to obtain journal articles that are not held by the University of Warwick. It is made up of an international consortium of academic libraries, who agree to share certain resources with other member institutions, in order to provide access to a much wider range of material.

A database search will prompt an Article Reach option, when no full text link is found via WebBridge. Just fill in the Article Reach

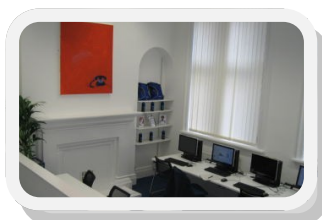

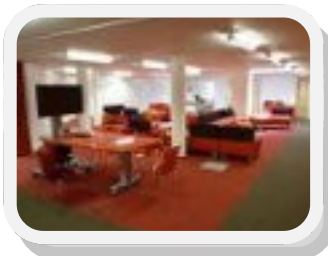
Study Spaces

There is still money for book ordering for this academic year. If you have any suggestions of new texts or can think of key texts that would benefit from further duplication then do let me know.

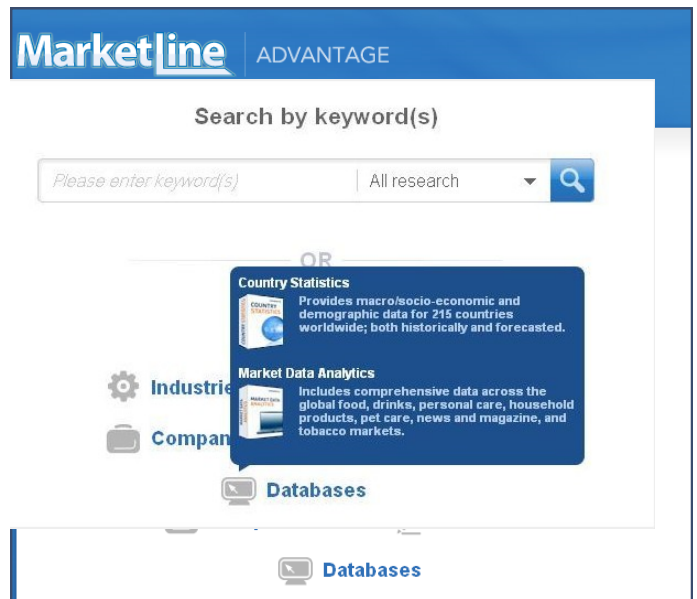

Did you know??

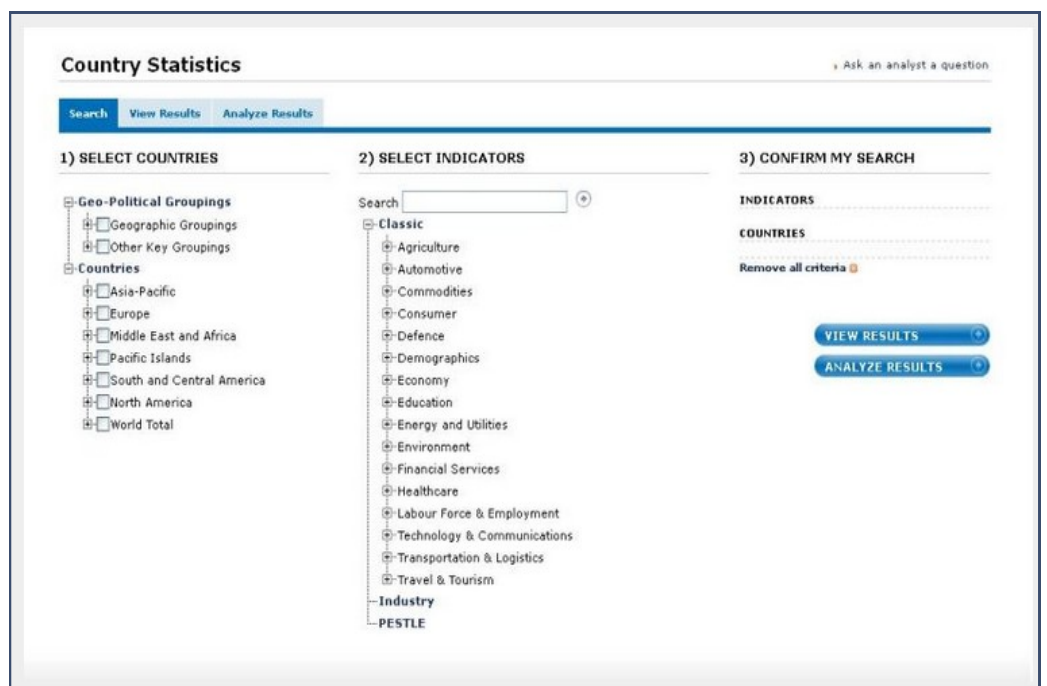
You now have another option for quick access to economic data, from Marketline's Country Statistics database.

This is a part of the Marketline subscription that is often missed, because it is not accessible from the main search or browse functions. Instead, you need to access the separate Country Statistics product through the database menu.

First select the country or countries you are interested in then the economic indicators. For most indicators you will have a choice of the absolute value, or % growth. Finally you can choose to view the results as a table, which can be downloaded to Excel, or analyse the results and create various charts from the data.



Marketline is accessible via the catalogue or Encore.
