Professor Gizelis' main research interests conflict dynamics, peacekeeping, social institutions and conflict management, gender and conflict resolution, and health institutions. She has published in *Journal of Conflict Resolution*, *Social Science and Medicine*, *Journal of Peace Research*, *Political Geography*, *International Interactions*, *Journal of Economic Development and Cultural Change*, and *Conflict and Cooperation*. She received an ESRC research grant for her project A Country of their Own: "Women's Organizations and Peacebuilding". Professor Verpoorten's research focuses on the economic causes and consequences of armed conflict; on natural resources, religion, global supply chains; and more broadly, on the economic and institutional development of Sub-Saharan Africa, with a special focus on Rwanda, Benin and DR Congo. She has extensive field experience in conflict zones. She collected household survey data in 2002 and 2003 in Rwanda in the provinces of Gikongoro and Gitarama, and in her doctoral dissertation analyzed the coping mechanisms Rwandan people resorted to during the conflict. She is currently conducting micro-level research in the Democratic Republic of Congo on the nexus between mineral resources, employment opportunities and conflict in the artisanal gold mining sector of South-Kivu, DRC. The project involves semi-structured interviews and structured surveys with gold miners in Congo.

Professor Arat (Yale College, BA '78, Princeton University PhD '83) is a chaired professor in the Department of Political Science and International Relations at Boğaziçi University, Istanbul, Turkey. She is an expert on gender-based violence in the Turkish context, has recently coauthored a book titled “Violence Against Women in Turkey: A Nationwide Survey” (Altınay and Arat, 2009). The book is the end product of a very successful survey study which professor Arat and her coauthor conducted in 2007 to assess the extent of spousal violence in Turkey. They interviewed 1800 ever-married women about their experience with spousal violence. Professor Arat was the Provost of her university between 2008-2012 and is a member of the Science Academy, Turkey.
