

Conference Sponsors

The Conference has been organised by the Centre for the Study of Globalisation and Regionalisation (CSGR). CSGR is supported by the *UK Economic and Social Research Council* and the University of Warwick. Inaugurated on 1 October 1997, it is the largest research centre dealing with the study of globalisation and regionalisation in Europe. CSGR has become an international site for research in this area. The research agenda of the Centre deals with the definition of globalisation, its impact and the policy implications.

There are two core sponsors for the conference:

the *UK Department for International Development (DfID)*;
and the *Global Development Network (GDN)*.

DfID is a UK Government department, working to promote sustainable development and eliminate world poverty (www.dfid.gov.uk). The central focus of the Government's policy, set out in the 1997 White Paper on International Development, is a commitment to the International Development Targets, to halve the proportion of people living in extreme poverty by 2015. Associated targets include basic health care provision and universal access to primary education by the same date. A second White Paper on International Development, published in December 2000, reaffirmed this commitment, while focusing specifically on how to manage the process of globalisation to benefit poor people. DFID seeks to work in partnership with governments committed to these targets, with business, civil society and the research community. DFID also works with multilateral institutions such as the World Bank, United Nations agencies and the European Community.

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
