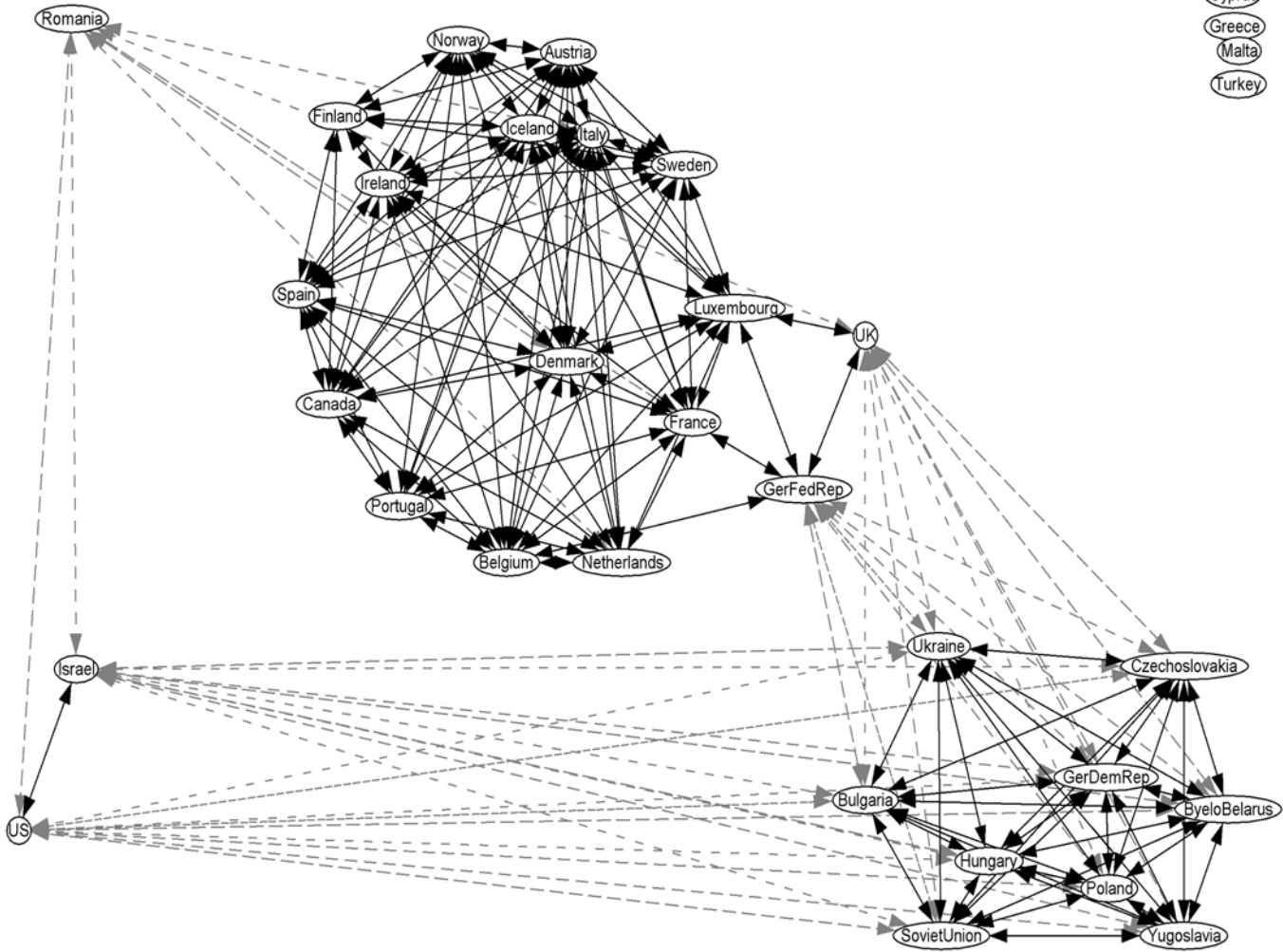

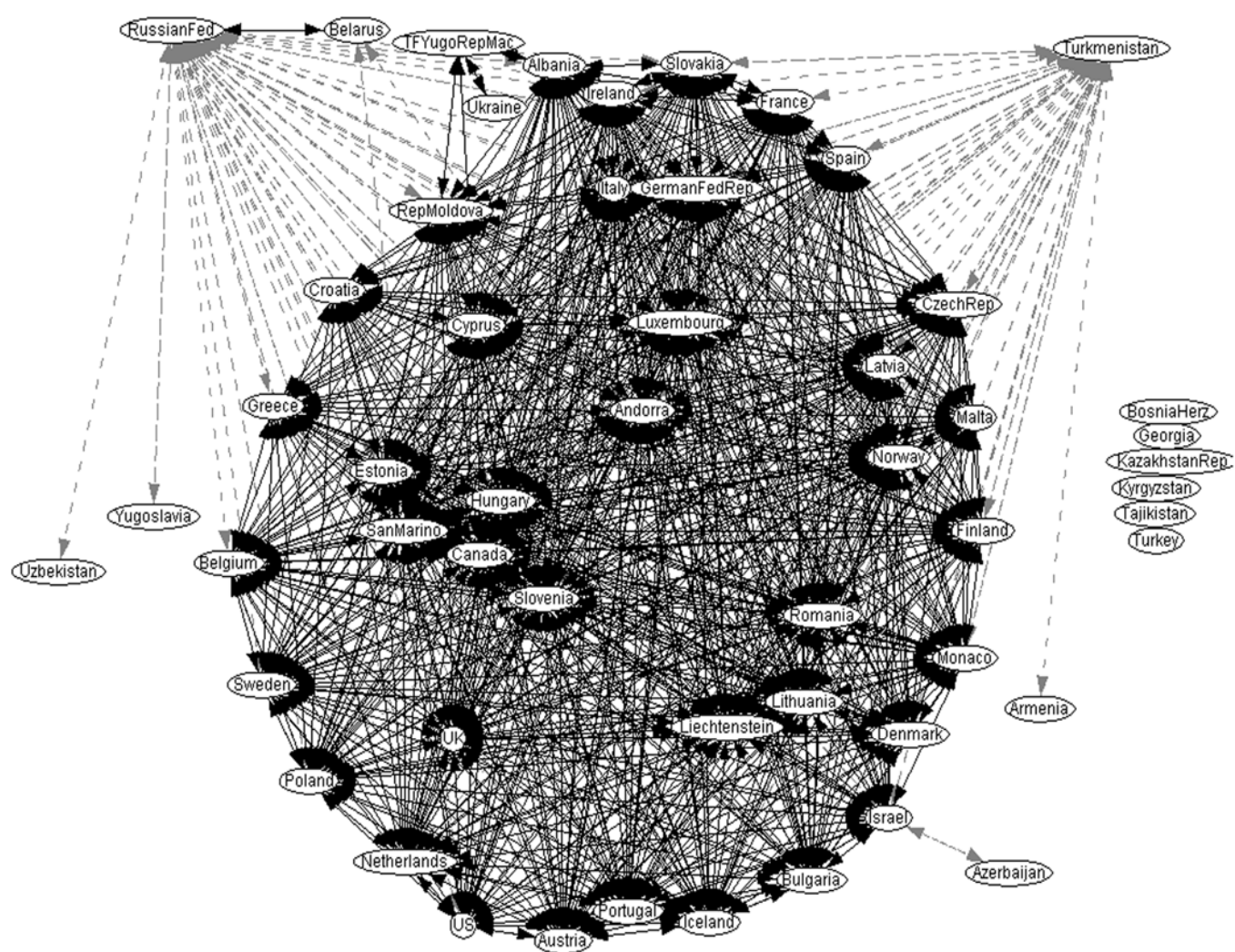

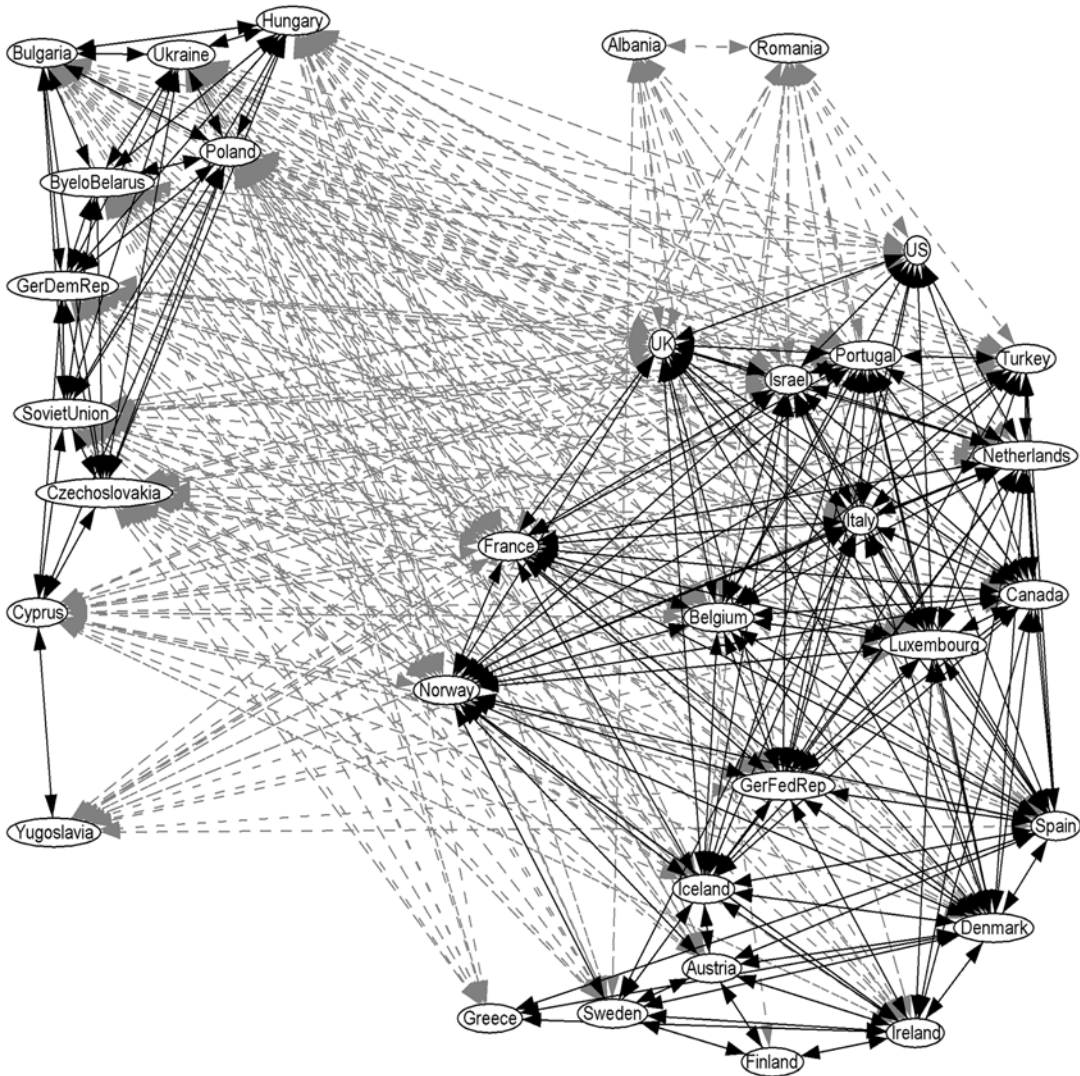
Europe, Ideology, Time 1: 1981-1985

Europe, Ideology, Time 4: 1996-2001

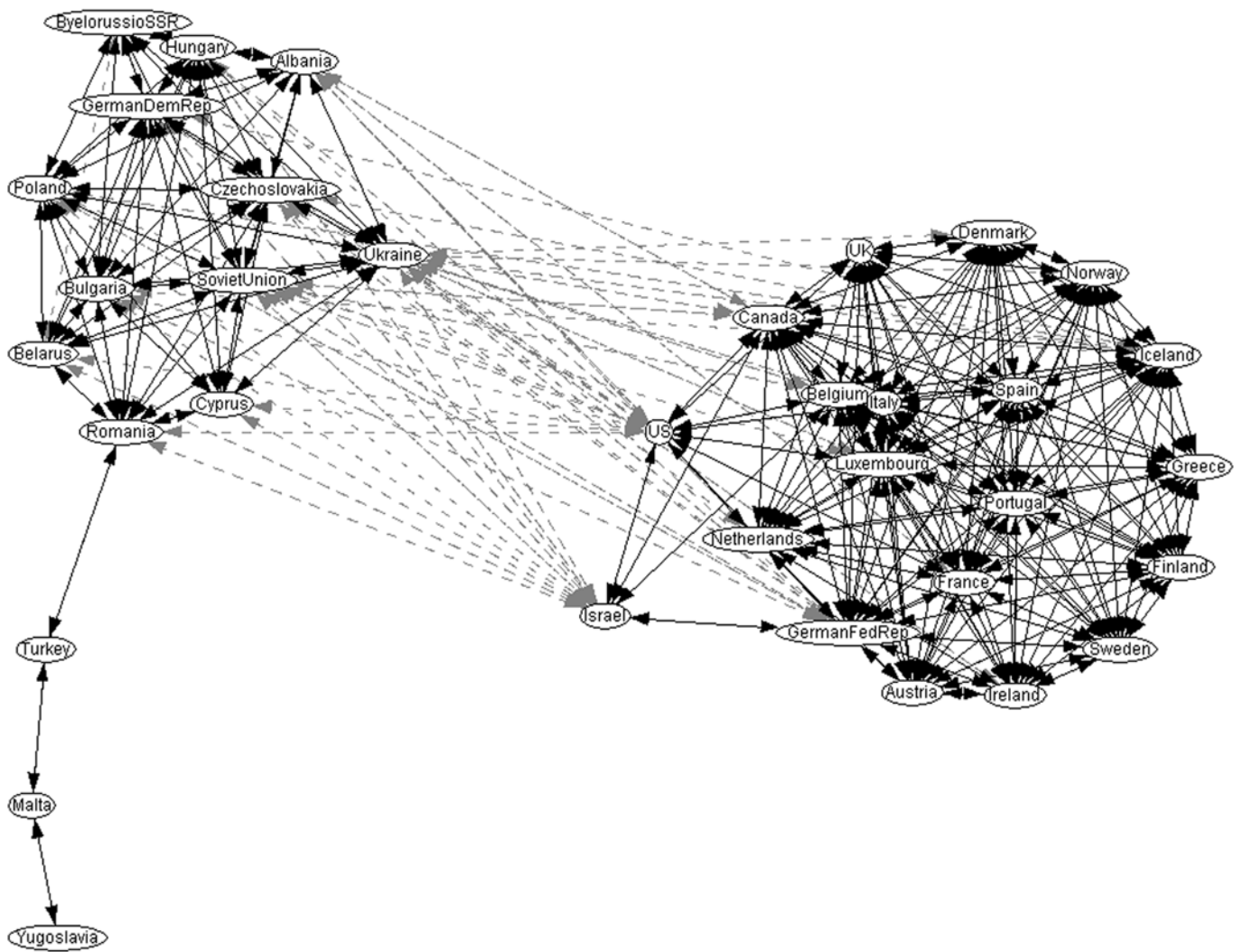

Europe, Military, Time 1: 1981-1985

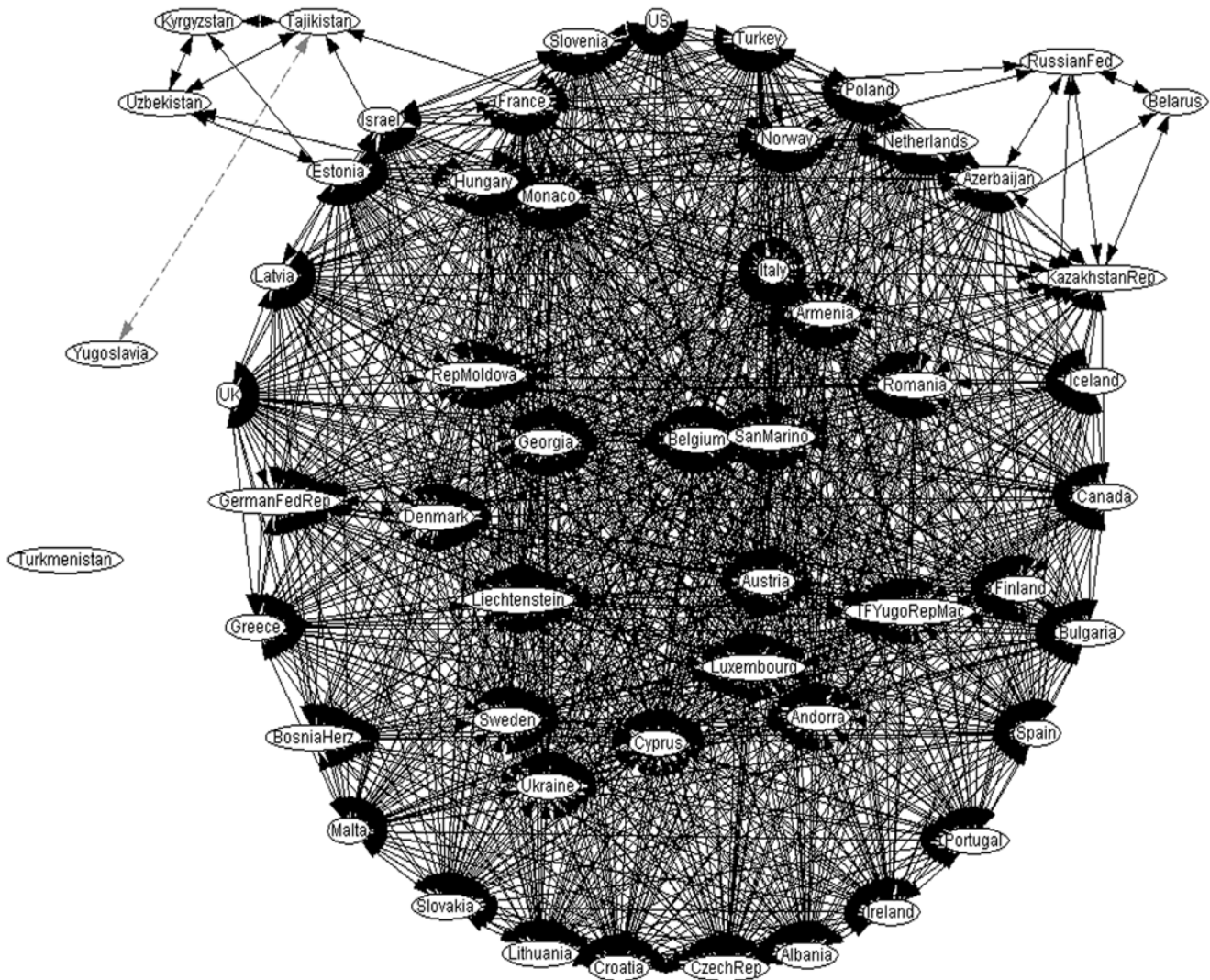

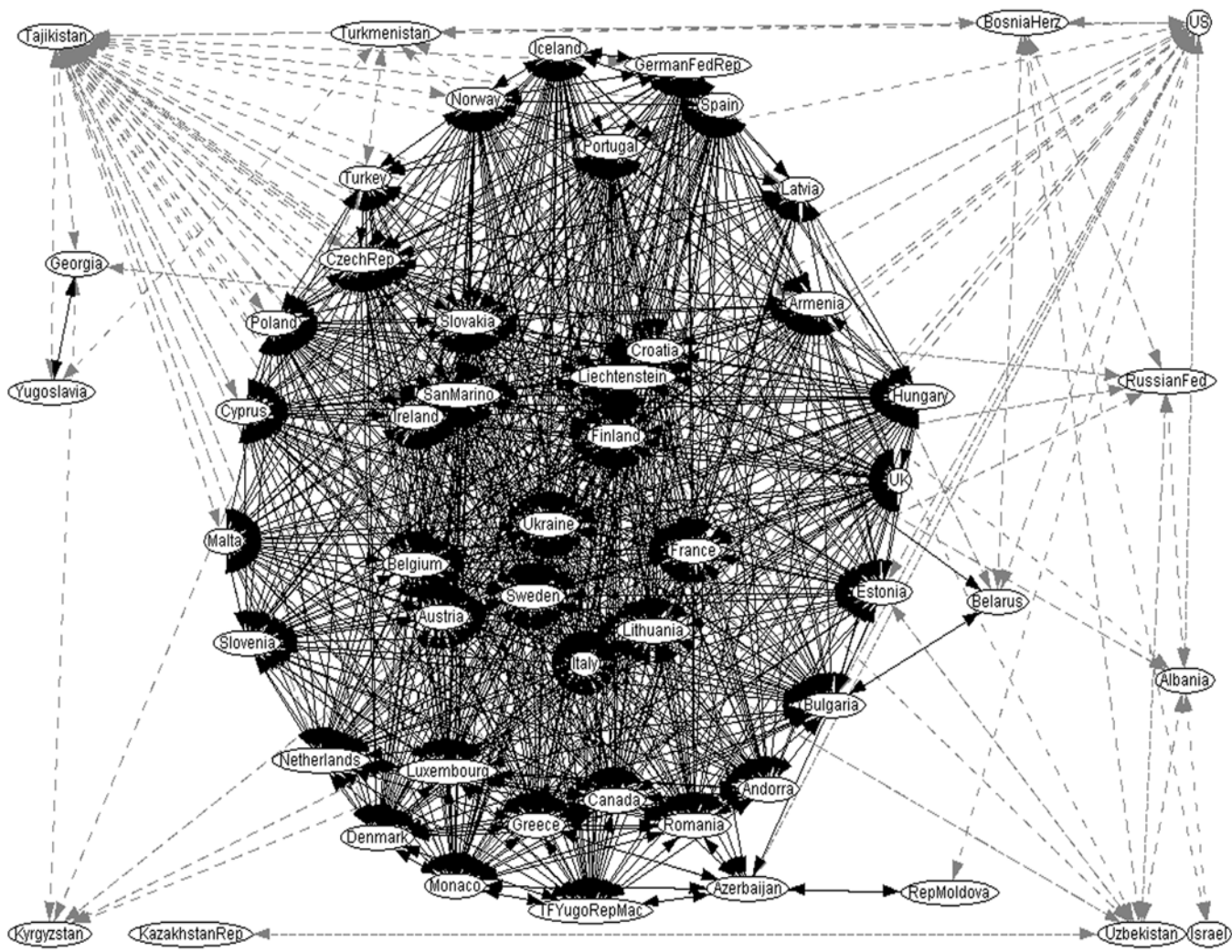

Europe, Military, Time 4: 1996-2001

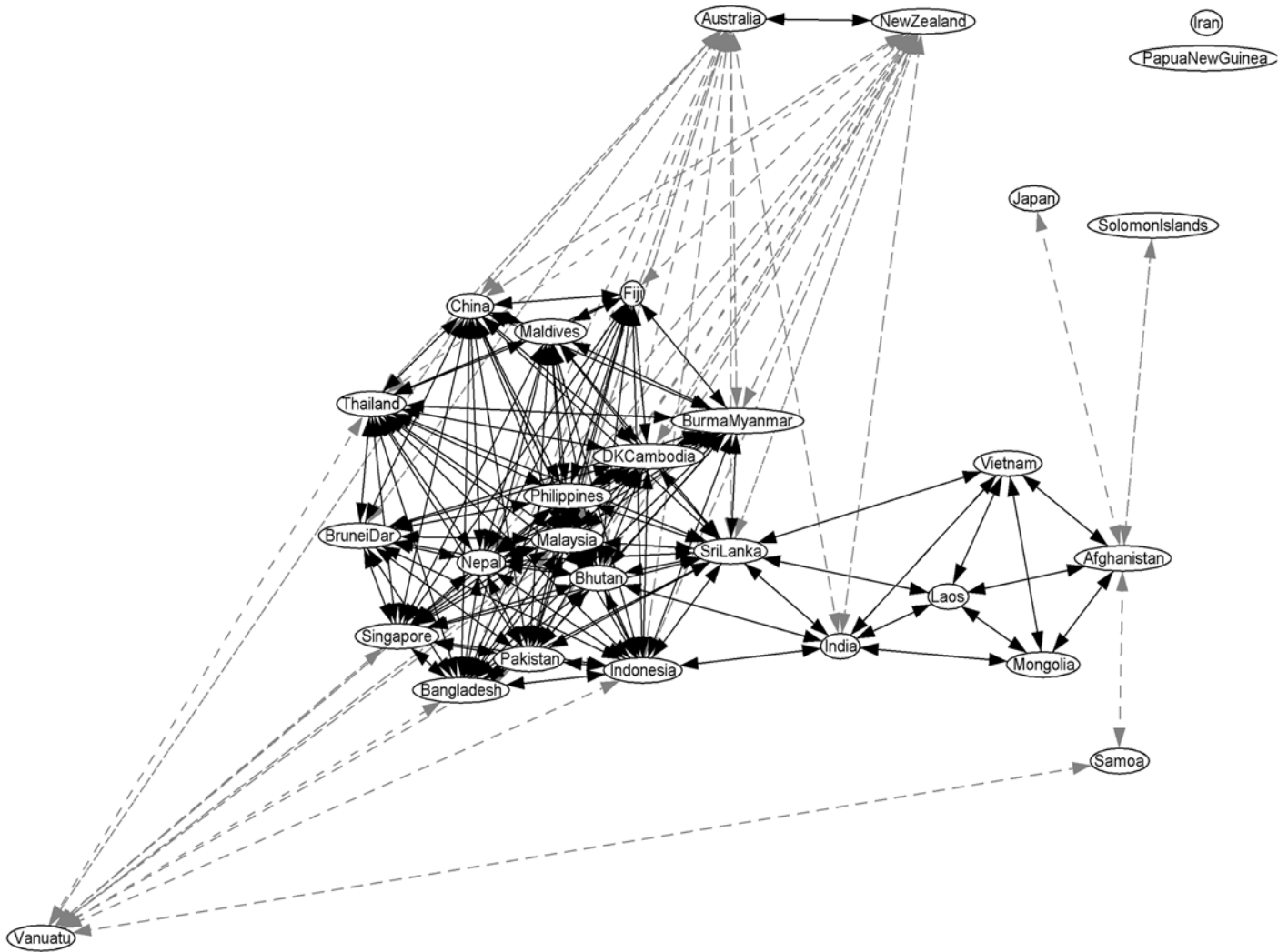

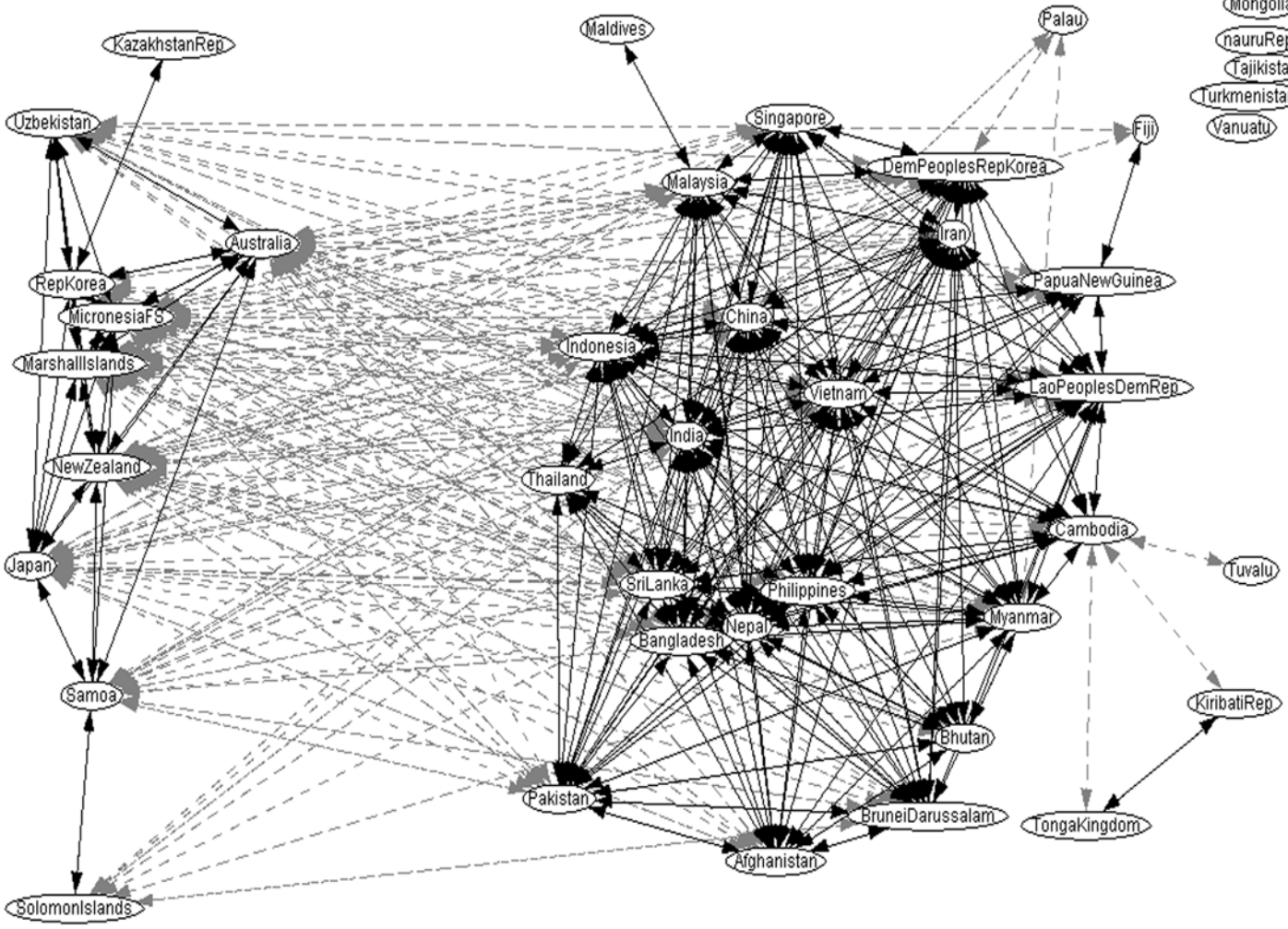




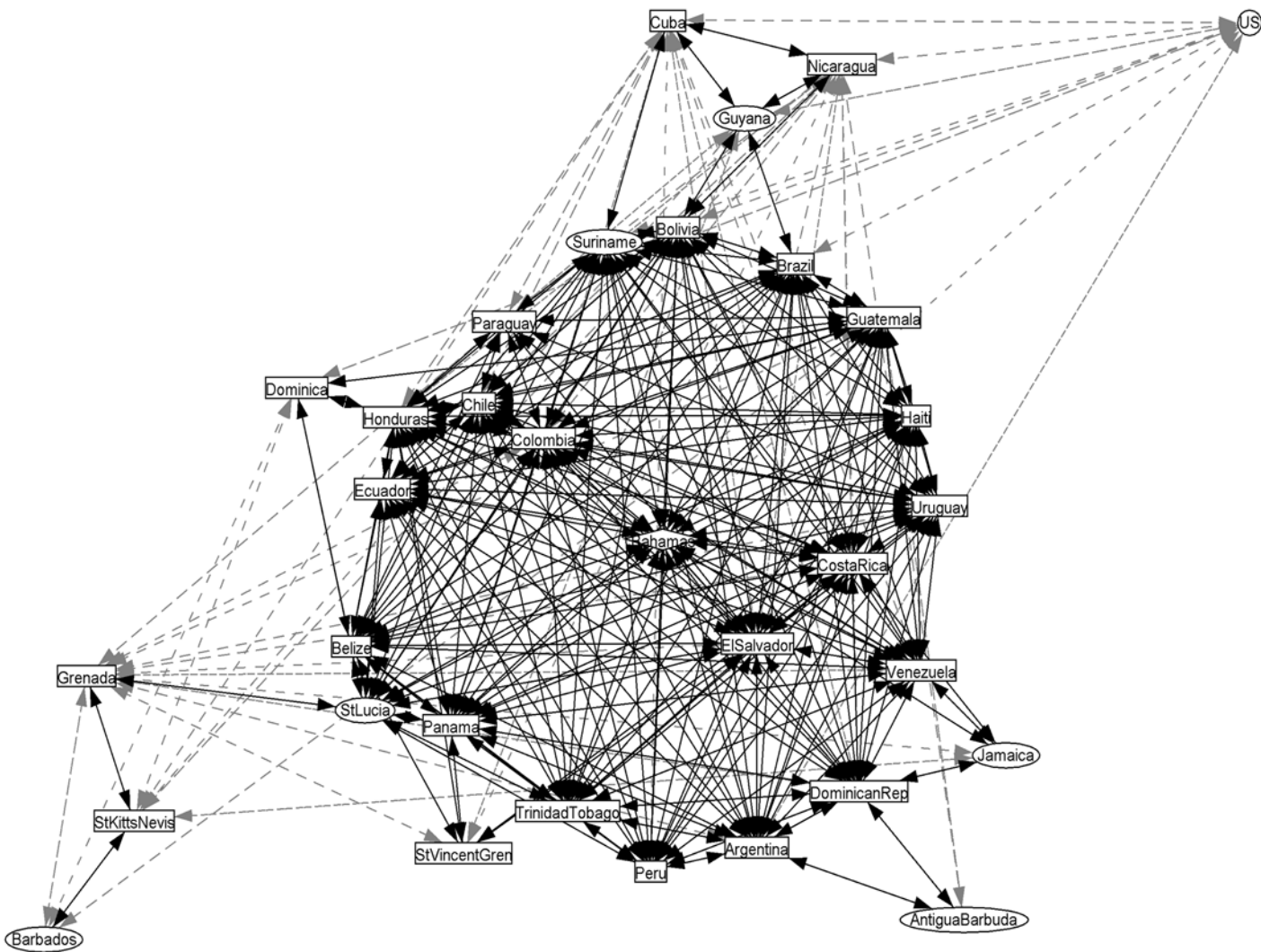
