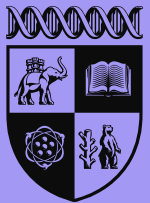

# Monitoring Points



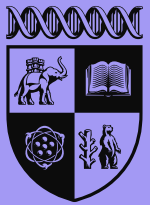
- 13 attendance checks throughout the academic year to ensure that you are engaging with your studies.
- 6 in Term 1; 5 in Term 2; 2 in Term 3
- Viewable now on your Tabula “Attendance” page
- First: meet with your Personal Tutor (more later)
- Mainly consist of seminar attendance – your record is also viewable on your Tabula “Attendance” page

# Monitoring Points



- The consequences of missing too many Monitoring Points are serious –including temporary and permanent withdrawal from your studies.
- Missed Monitoring Points may only be excused for documented medical reasons – complete the [online form](#) if this is the case.
- Excused absences from seminars do not mean excused absences from Monitoring Points.

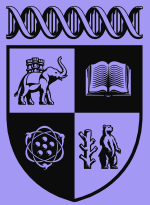
