## What is "Good Theorising" in Ethnographic Research

We ask you then to think through the following questions which we will discuss during the session:

If you choose to bring an example of interesting theorisation in ethnography, please consider the following questions:

How did the author(s) move from data to theory?
What type of theory did they propose? Mid-range, grand theory etc?
What was one key learning point for you?

If you choose to bring a paper about theorising in ethnography, please summarise 3 points of what you considered to be most useful in the paper.
