Mirian A. Mijangos García is a singer and activist for the rights of undocumented immigrants in the United States. She is also a naturopath, domestic worker and mother of two. She has written various songs and performed on numerous stages across the country. She is the author of Decolonizing Ethnography: Undocumented Immigrants and New Directions in Social Science (Duke University Press, 2019).
