Narrative Strategies of Writing Ethnography Or Representing Your Data

In this session we will discuss and learn together about writing ethnographies and presenting ethnographic data. We will focus in particular on the existing conventions on how to organise ethnographic texts, what narrative structures are often used and, how to structure the findings.

The session will be divided into two parts. In part one Davide Nicolini will present a brief overview of some common narratives structures used in academic ethnography. In part two we will all participate in a “show and tell” exercise in which participants are encouraged to bring, show and comment on an exemplar of what they (or their discipline) consider a piece of **conventional** ethnography and an example of **unconventional** ethnography.
