



SPUDM 2021 Call for Papers

The European Association for Decision Making invites submissions for presentations, posters and/or symposia for the **28th Biennial SPUDM** (Subjective Probability, Utility and Decision Making) Conference which will be hosted online by Warwick Business School and the Department of Psychology at the University of Warwick, UK, from **22 – 24 August 2021**.

SPUDM has been the leading European decision making and behavioural economics conference since its inception in 1969. Those years have seen SPUDM host the greatest researchers in our field, and we are committed to keeping this tradition alive and making this 28th meeting, the first to be held entirely online, one of the very best.

Our keynote speakers include **Rory Sutherland** (Vice Chairman of Ogilvy & Mather Advertising) and Professor **Gaëlle Vallée-Tourangeau** (President-elect EADM). There will also be a special guest appearance by **Daniel Kahneman**, who will field questions about his forthcoming book *Noise* (co-written with Oliver Sibony and Cass Sunstein).

We will host papers, discussions and posters covering the full range of modern thinking in behavioural science, behavioural economics, and judgment and decision making. We strongly encourage submissions from new researchers, from researchers in countries less represented in the JDM community, and from researchers working in new areas and in the applications of behavioural science.

The deadline for submissions is **Friday 30 April 2021**.

General information

We ask all applicants to provide both a short and (except for poster only submissions) a long abstract. The short abstract will be published in the conference programme. Final decisions will be communicated by Monday 31 May 2021.

We invite three kinds of submission: individual papers, posters and symposia.

Presentations will be shorter than in a live conference, and there will be more opportunity for discussion. Poster sessions will be highly interactive. SPUDM 2021 will not replicate the in-person conference but take advantage of the opportunities offered by this year's online format.

Individual papers

Individual papers will be followed by moderated discussion.

Submissions for individual papers should include:

- A title of maximum 140 characters including spaces
- Names of presenting author and co-authors and their affiliations
- A short abstract of maximum 900 characters including spaces (to be published in the programme)
- A summary of your paper in Tweet form, with your Twitter handle (optional)
- A long abstract of maximum 3000 characters including spaces, specifying the aim, method, results and conclusions of the research.

Posters

Posters will be highly interactive and offer the opportunity to present data and have substantive discussions with interested colleagues.

Submission for posters should include:

- A title of maximum 140 characters including spaces
- Names of presenting author and co-authors and their affiliations
- A short abstract of maximum 900 characters including spaces (to be posted in the programme).

During the conference, the scientific committee will select three posters as the winners of the SPUDM 2021 poster awards.

Symposia

Symposia should consist of 3-5 speakers on a related topic, with a preliminary presentation followed by discussion led by a convener. Other formats are possible, but emphasis should be placed on interactive discussions.

Submissions for symposia should include:

- A symposium title of maximum 140 characters including spaces
- Names and affiliations of the speakers and the convener
- A short abstract summarizing the background, aims and objectives of the symposium (maximum 900 characters) to be published in the programme
- A long abstract, giving further details on the symposium format and the individual contributions (maximum 3000 characters).
