If you are a collaborator, we will collect your name, contact details and project proposals. |
| The special categories of your personal data that we will process: | We have an optional diversity monitoring form which collects your ethnic origin. We process this data in order to promote and monitor diversity in data science. |
| Our lawful basis for processing your personal data: | The processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of our official authority. |
| Our purposes for processing your personal data: | We will process your personal data for the purpose of application review and selection, and associated administrative purposes including contacting you to notify you of the outcome of your application. |
| Who we will share your personal data with: | We will share your personal data with our DSSGX collaborator the University of Kaiserslautern, and challenge owners. Aggregated summary information may be shared for reporting purposes. We use third party service providers in relation to archiving, records management, and IT support and maintenance. |
