

## Cyber Security Global Research Priorities- Early Career Fellowships

### Introduction

The Cyber Security GRP invites applications from internal early career candidates interested broadly in Cyber Security. These Early Career Fellowships are designed to facilitate greater knowledge exchange and interdisciplinary collaboration in the area of Cyber Security and are offered by the Warwick Global Research Priorities in Cyber Security. Applications which are broadly aligned with Cyber Security and are collaborative and international in scope will be favoured.

### Eligibility

Fellowships are open to postgraduate students/ researchers from the University of Warwick from any discipline working in or around the field of Cyber Security. Applicants should be studying for a PhD at the University of Warwick, will have been accepted onto a PhD programme at the University, or be on a research contract having earned their doctorate within the past 12 months.

### Provision

Up to £1000 is available to each successful applicant; all funds must be costed against travel, subsistence and networking activity. In exceptional circumstances this may be increased to a maximum level of £2000. Please note that this funding cannot be used to buy equipment.

Fellowships may be used to facilitate one or more of the following:

- Short research exchanges
- Events/ conferences on Cyber Security (requires co-branding of materials)
- Collaborative research projects
- Internships
- Conference visits (proof of paper acceptance required; expenses only; the Cyber Security GRP must be acknowledged in proceedings).

All visits are to take place before 31/07/23.

### Application Procedure

Your application should be a maximum of 750 words (2 sheets of A4) and include:

- Candidate biography
- Bibliography of any publications, conference presentations, etc.
- Statement of Support
- Project and costs outline (if Fellowship is to be used to facilitate a project, internship or exchange please include a proposed timeline)
- Anticipated outcomes.

Applications will be assessed on an ad hoc basis and will be considered on merit and availability of funds. The academic co-leads of the Cyber Security GRP (Professor Tim Watson, Professor Carsten Maple, Professor Richard Aldrich and Dr Hongkai Wen) will assess all applications.
