

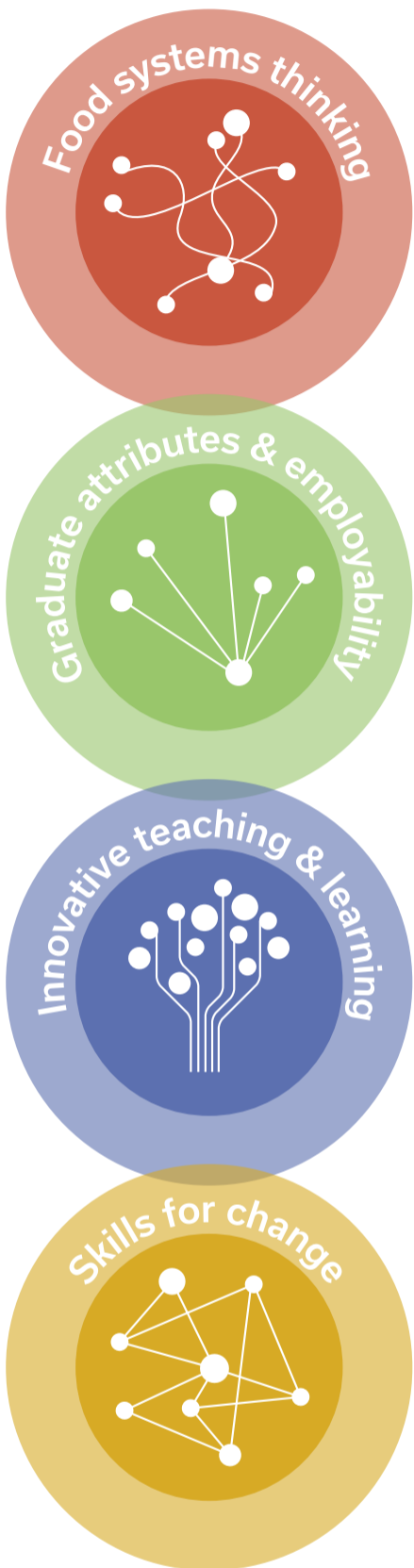
Learn the skills to transform the food system
