Annual Photography Competition 2018-19 Hope, Democracy and Development

The GRP International Development Annual Photography Competition has, for the past four years, attracted hundreds of high quality photographs taken in locations all over the world. The Competition is open to any University of Warwick student or staff member. We are looking for photographic images that address the annual research theme on 'Hope, Democracy and Development'. Photographic submissions can interpret this theme in broad terms, and all submissions (whether taken by cell phone, professional camera, or a composite image formed with software or an app) will be considered equally.

There are two submission deadlines:
Submission deadline 1: 20th December 2018 (for inclusion in the exhibition at the City Arcadia Gallery, Coventry City as well as the competition prizes).
Submission deadline 2: 1st April 2019 (for the competition prizes only).

Prizes: First Prize £150; Second Prize: £100; Third Prize £50.

Please note: selected submissions from the first deadline will feature in a forthcoming public exhibition at the CITY ARCADIA GALLERY, City Arcade, Coventry, January 2019.

All submissions will be considered for the prizes, and the winners will be determined by a Jury of experts, who will award the three prizes along with recommendations for other outstanding photographs.

The Judgement Criteria are: (i) Response to the theme of the Competition (ii) Creativity and originality (iii) Technical and aesthetic quality of the image (iv) Composition and framing (v) Conceptual meaning.

Winners will be formally announced at the previous GRP International Development Annual Post Graduate Conference - in June 2019 to be advertised.
