#### Registration - Action Required

Please now complete our graduation registration process by visiting the <u>Awards and Ceremonies</u> <u>website</u>. Please do this as soon as possible and by Friday 27 November 2020 to ensure your certificate is posted at the earliest opportunity.

In order to graduate in absentia in December 2020/January 2021, you must complete the registration process in order to register an address for your certificate. If you do not register, your certificate will be kept on file at the university, and will only be posted to you if you later make contact with us.

## Receiving your certificate - WMG Students

Due to a late WMG exam board, please be aware that it will not be possible to issue degree certificates for any eligible WMG students prior to the Christmas break. As such, **certificates for WMG students will be issued throughout January 2021**. In order to guarantee your certificate is included in our first print runs, you should ensure you complete the registration process by Friday 27 November 2020. Further information about certificate issuing is included in the registration process and the confirmation email you will receive on completion. We will notify you via email when your certificate has been posted in January and ask for your patience and that you do not contact us asking when your certificate will be sent, as this will only delay the posting of certificates while we respond to such queries.

Please understand that it will take a number of weeks to post all certificates. Awards are still expected to be conferred in December, at which time you will receive confirmation via email of the conferral of your award and, a few days later, a digital confirmation of award letter to use as evidence of your award in the meantime. The date of your award used on your certificate will be the date your award is conferred in December, and is separate to when your certificate is issued.

## **Eligibility**

Receipt of this email or completion of the registration process does not constitute eligibility to graduate. In order to be eligible to graduate (in absentia), your name must appear on a Pass List/Decision Record Log and be approved by the University's Senate or the Steering Committee on behalf of the Senate, for a degree level qualification, and you must not be in study related debt to the University by the deadlines stated.

In many cases, you will be receiving this invitation before your results are released. This is the normal process and it is important that you register BEFORE you know your results so that we capture the relevant information required in order for us to issue certificates as soon as possible.

## **Outstanding Fees**

Please note that the deadline for payment of any outstanding study related fees and charges to the University is 16:00 (GMT) on Friday 4 December 2020 (cleared funds). If you have outstanding study related fees or charges after this date, we regret that your graduation and posting of your certificate will be delayed.
