






Our campus

Central Campus


The heart of campus close to many of the main facilities including the library, the Students' Union, bars, shops and cafés.

At Warwick we pride ourselves on diversity and inclusion.



Here's a short introduction to the support services available to the Warwick community.

The Residential Community Team

The team live alongside students in our halls of residence on campus and play a key role in building a community at Warwick. The Residential Community Team is your first point of contact if you're having personal problems, feeling homesick, require support resolving an issue that may have occurred in campus accommodation or need signposting to specialist services if you're unsure where to go for support. They also host fun events that encourage you to make lifelong friends. They are available to support you 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year whether it be in person at our hub or drop ins, by email, or by phone – in and out of hours!


You may already be thinking about where you would live after the first year.

There are various options available for returning undergraduate students in their second year and beyond. But you won't be left on your own to navigate the process - Warwick offers services to support you with finding somewhere to live whether it be in campus halls or private accommodation.

For some students, the chance to leave campus and move into a house in one of the local areas with friends they've made during the first year is an exciting prospect.

However, it may seem a little overwhelming to find your own accommodation and that's why Warwick offers a property search tool exclusively for Warwick students. Warwick Studentpad allows local landlords who meet our eligibility criteria to advertise their properties to you as well as allowing you to make contact with those landlords to arrange viewings or ask questions about bills, etc. There is also a chat room where you can connect with other Warwick students to share your experiences of house hunting or find housemates all in one place. It's a helping hand for those who might need it.


