		Where kitchens are used, the extractor fan should be used and turned off after use.  Groups cannot use the Chaplaincy kitchens to cater for events which are not				
		booked in the Central Space or taking place in the Jewish rooms or Islamic Prayer Halls.  Only electrical items which have been PAT (Portable Appliance Test) tested, can				
		be used in the Chaplaincy spaces. Societies can arrange for this through the Student Union.				
Injury caused by activities and trips, slips and falls	All staff and students in the Chaplaincy	It is not expected that any use of the Chaplaincy spaces will incur injury as activities of a hazardous nature are not allowed.  First aid kits are provided in each Chaplaincy kitchen and there are qualified first aiders in the Chaplaincy, Senate House and the buildings that the Buddhist Room and Multi Faith Prayer Rooms are located in. Additionally, the Community Safety Team can be called 24/7 on 02476 522 222 and are all qualified first aiders.
