

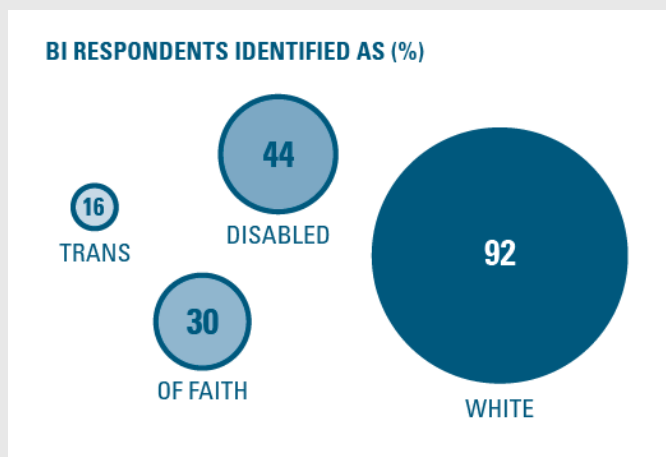
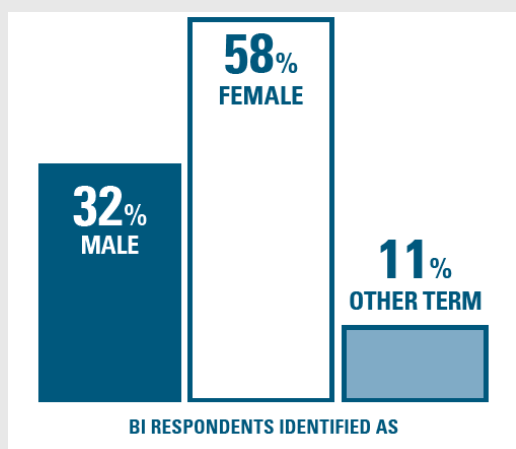
BI INCLUSION

The latest Stonewall Bi Report draws on analysis taken from the [LGBT in Britain Survey](#) data.

Stonewall uses the term 'bi' to refer to people who have a romantic and/or sexual attraction towards more than one gender. People under the bi umbrella may describe themselves using one or more of a wide variety of terms, including, but not limited to, bisexual, pan, and queer.

Respondents who identified as bi

- 31% of respondents identified as bi.
- 32% were male.
- 58% were female.
- 11% used some other term for their gender.



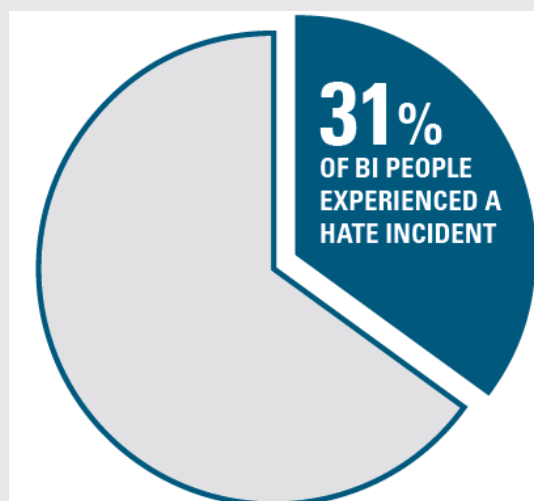
Hate Crime and Discrimination

31% of bi people had been insulted, pestered, intimidated, or harassed in the year prior to being surveyed. Of these, 75% had not reported it to the police, many because they feared it would not be taken seriously.

13% of bi women, 12% of bi men, and 17% of non-binary people have faced intimate partner abuse in the year prior.

This compares to 7.9% of women and 4.2% of men in the general population.

42% of bi respondents felt that their sexual orientation might have been a motivating factor.



Being out as bi

- 36% of bi people are out to all their friends, compared to 74% of gay & lesbian people.
- 20% of bi people are out to all their family, compared to 63% of gay & lesbian people.

*"Immediate family [who I live with] have always made **comments about bi people being greedy or indecisive.** So I cannot come out."*
