STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 1982 INDEX OF CONTENTS

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ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Revenue Income and Expenditure

This account includes all revenue grants, fees and other income received and receivable for the year.

All revenue expenditure for the year is charged to this account including allocations to meet future expenditure which is chargeable against the revenue of the current year. Major allocations for future expenditure are transferred to funds created for that purpose. Minor allocations are carried forward in creditors.

Income from research grants is included to the extent of expenditure incurred during the year and unexpended grants are carried forward in creditors.

Gross investment income is credited to the income and expenditure account after transfers of notional interest have been made to part of the renewals fund.

Surpluses accumulated externally by academic departments are carried forward as creditors for future expenditure by those departments.

Captial Expenditure

Capital expenditure is written off against grants and loans for specific purposes and the general revenue of the University. Loan interest and capital repayments are made from revenue.

Debtors and Prepayments

Specific provisions are made for any debts considered to be doubtful and known bad debts are written off.

Stocks

Stocks include goods for resale in catering departments, bars and the bookshop and are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Stocks of consumable materials are written off to revenue as incurred.

Specific Funds

Grants and revenue allocations are taken into funds to meet future expenditure for specific purposes.

The University of Warwick Foundation Fund

The University of Warwick Foundation Fund is vested in and administered separately by the Trustees. It does not therefore form part of these accounts.

- At 31 July 1982 loans in respect of capital expenditure previously incurred and outstanding to the Foundation Fund were £2,117,950 (1981 £2,162,777) and secured loans repayable to Building Societies were £709,375 (1981 £714,308).
- 3. For insurance purposes, the buildings and equipment are valued at £111,442,100.
- 4. Creditors and accrued liabilities

Included in creditors and accrued liabilities are specific items amounting to £194,208 (1981 £126,710) provided from revenue for future expenditure, and also surplus balances amounting to £282,341 (1981 £180,290) accumulated externally by academic departments.

5. Charitable Status

The University is a charity in accordance with Section 4 of the Charities Act 1960.

6. Loan Debtors

Loan debtors represent amounts expended on certain capital projects which are recoverably by way of future revenue surpluses generated from those projects.

Projects Temporarily Unfinanced

Projects temporarily unfinanced represent amounts expended by the University on certain capital and other projects which will eventually be financed from other sources.

8. Current account with University of Warwick Foundation

The Foundation Fund has made grants and loans for building projects in excess of the cash currently available within that fund. The figure of £731,719 (1981 £768,955) reflects the loan made by the University to cover the short fall.

AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE COUNCIL OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WARWICK

We have audited the accounts on pages 1 to 8 in accordance with approved Auditing Standards. The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

We draw attention to the accounting policies set out on page 1 which set out the bases on which these accounts have been prepared.

In our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the income and expenditure of the University for the year ended 31 July 1982 and of its funds at that date.

We have examined the records of moneys expended during the year out of non-recurrent grants made to the University for specific purposes. In our opinion the grants have been properly applied for the purposes intended.
