083 **Employability Strategy**

The Senate received the Employability Strategy (083-S120619) and a report from the Academic Director (Employability and Skills). The key details and discussions were as follows:

- The Postgraduate Officer of the Students' Union had worked closely with the Academic Director on the early development of the Strategy.
- The Director of Student Opportunity had now been appointed to lead the teams who would deliver the Strategy.
- In response to a query from PT, that the creation of the Warwick core skills could include digital skills.
- In response to a query from RG, that a central placements unit was being created which would align to work being undertaken in departments and specifically the work of placements officers.
- That financial support was available for students to take up internships and that the newly launched Warwick Scholars scheme also included provision for internships.
- In response to a query from AL on ensuring that there is an international focus to employability, that this remained the case and the international focus was being broadened in scope.

DECISION: The Senate **approved** the Employability Strategy.

084 **Social Inclusion Strategy**

The Senate received the Social Inclusion Strategy report (084-S120619) and a report from the Director of Social Inclusion. The key details and discussions were as follows:

- The Equality and Diversity Committee would be disestablished, with a new Social Inclusion Committee being established, chaired by the Provost.
- In response to a query from LR on the alignment of the Social Inclusion and Student Recruitment Strategies, a mapping of professional services and committees to the areas covered by the Strategy would be provided in the next year and that the Widening Participation team had been closely involved in the development of the Strategy;
- References to staff included those employed through Unitemps.
- The Strategy would link with other strategies also under development.
- There was much good practice being done across the University locally but this needed to be scaleable and applied at leadership level.

DECISION: The Senate **recommended** the Social Inclusion Strategy to the Council.

085 Student Recruitment Strategy

The Senate received the Student Recruitment Strategy report (085-S120619) and a report from the Director of the Student Recruitment, Admissions and Outreach Service (SROAS). The key details and discussions were as follows:

- In response to a query from LJ, growth and distribution across disciplines is based on work undertaken on the future size and shape of the University, reported to Senate previously.
- Reducing barriers to entry should not reduce the overall entry tariff and there was pressure on league table providers to move away from using tariff on entry as a measure of quality;
- Data is now available to inform longer term resource planning.

• In response to a query submitted by Dr Schwartz-Leeper on the balance of planned recruitment across disciplines, that course content needs to remain attractive to prospective students.

DECISION: The Senate approved the Student Recruitment Strategy.

087 Chair's Business

In addition to the Chair's Update report (087-S120619), the Senate received a verbal report from the Chair on the following items:

(a) Death of student Josh Hill

With the deepest regret, it was reported that Josh Hill, a second year student studying Data Science at the University, had passed away in hospital overnight on Monday 10 June following a fall in the Mathematical Sciences Building.

Professor Bärbel Finkenstädt Rand, Head of Statistics, had reported prior to the meeting that "the whole department is deeply saddened and distressed by the death of this lovely, gentle, kind young man. Our thoughts are with Josh's family".

(b) Institutional Success

The Guardian 2020 University Guide was published on 7 June 2019 with Warwick ranked 9th overall. The Guardian had also placed 10 subjects at Warwick in the UK's top 10 and a further 10 in the top 20 – with Film and Television Studies ranked 1st in the UK.

(c) Queen's Birthday Honours

The following University staff members had been awarded the following honours:

- (i) Professor Sudhesh Kumar, Dean of Warwick Medical School, had been made an OBE for services to medicine and to diabetes care.
- (ii) Matthew Scott, Senior Warden, had been awarded a British Empire Medal, for services to students and the community in Warwick
