002	<p>Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II</p> <p>The Senate noted that the University had joined communities around the world in expressing deep sorrow at the death of Her Majesty The Queen on 8 September 2022.</p> <p>Like many universities in the UK, the University of Warwick was granted its Royal Charter of Incorporation in 1965 by Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. The university’s flags had been at half-mast to pay respects and honour</p>

	<p>the Queen's memory and a book of condolences had been made available for members of staff, students and alumni to pay tribute to Her Majesty The Queen.</p> <p>The condolences of the Senate were noted.</p>
003	<p>Introductions</p> <p>The Chair welcomed all, and the following newly appointed/elected members to their first meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr Freeha Azmat (Representative of the Assembly, Warwick Manufacturing Group) • Professor Sarah Richardson (History) • Professor Michael Scott (Classics and Ancient History) <p>The Chair welcomed the new Students' Union members:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Will Brewer, President of the Students' Union • Chih-Hsiang Lo, SU Vice-President Education • Hamza Rehman, SU Vice-President Postgraduate <p>The Chair also welcomed back:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr Chris Twine as Secretary to Council • Roberta Wooldridge Smith as Interim Academic Registrar. <p>The Senate noted its revised schedule of meetings with effect from the current academic year, starting with a face-to-face focussed agenda meeting and followed by four online meetings with standard agendas to consider items of Senate business.</p> <p>The Chair reported that the first meeting would provide time to regroup in-person, to hear the full range of Senate members contributing to Senate business, and to be more strategic in the business considered at Senate.</p>
004	<p>Declarations of Interest</p> <p>No new declarations were made.</p>
005	<p>a) Minutes of meeting held on 6 July 2022</p> <p>The minutes of the meeting held on 6 July 2022 (005a-S210922, Protected) were approved subject to the revisions discussed at the meeting.</p> <p>b) Minutes of meeting held on 18 July 2022</p> <p>The minutes of the meeting held on 18 July 2022 (005b-S210922, Protected) were approved.</p>
006	<p>Matters arising from meetings held on 6 and 18 July 2022</p> <p>a) Update on Residential Life System</p> <p>It was noted that the Secretary to Council had updated Senators by email on the discussion of the Senate report at Council on Wednesday 13 July, as follows:</p> <p><i>The Council acknowledged the concerns of some members of the community but, given the significant risks within the RLT provision and the clear benefits for students that can be gained from a new approach, they saw no reason for the University not to continue with the implementation. However, in light of the concerns raised, especially those relating to out of hours provision and the potential overlap with the Estates Evolve Review, the Council also agreed the following actions:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <i>To keep the implementation under review on a termly basis initially, through a joint Senate and UEB working group to report to the Council on progress with RLT implementation (Registrar)</i> 2. <i>Monitor the level of demand after 11pm and whether the support available is sufficient, as well as conducting a gap analysis of the current services across the demand side (including Estates, mental health and any others) and how they map on to the new structure (Registrar/Director of Wellbeing)</i>

	<p>3. Consider on-campus accommodation options for Post Graduate Researchers (Group Finance Director). Senate members will be updated on these actions in due course.</p> <p>The Vice-Provost and Chair of the Board of the Faculty of Social Sciences provided a verbal update as Chair of the joint Senate and UEB working group on the implementation of changes to the RLT system. The group had been established and would meet on 30 September to review its draft terms of reference; receive a briefing on the changes being implemented with effect from the autumn term; and agree a method and schedule to establish measures of success. The group would also seek to address concerns raised by Senators at the meeting on 6 July (as part of discussion on the Report from the Assembly).</p> <p>It was highlighted that principles of Equality, Diversity and Inclusion and student wellbeing should, and would, be factored in and hardwired into the work of the group.</p>

007	<p>Membership of the Senate 2022-23</p> <p>The report (007-S210922, Public) setting out the Senate membership for 2022-23 was received and noted.</p> <p>Note: The terms of reference of the Senate were as set out in Statute 8 (Powers of the Senate) and Ordinance 5 (The Senate: Powers of the Senate).</p>
008	<p>Standing Orders of the Senate 2022-23</p> <p>The Standing Orders of the Senate (008-S210922, Public) were received, including proposed updates to agenda review process (following changes to the role of the Steering Committee) and some minor formatting amendments.</p> <p>The Director of Education Policy and Quality and Senate Assistant Secretary reported that as discussed at the March 2022 meeting of Senate, a refresh of academic governance effectiveness would commence in the current academic year, including a review of delegations from Senate and University Regulations. It was further noted that committee constitutions and diversity of membership would also be considered.</p> <p>DECISION: The Senate approved its Standing Orders for 2022-23.</p>

009	<p>Chair's Business</p> <p>There was no Chair's business.</p>

010	<p>External Regulatory Environment: Office for Students</p> <p>The Director of Education Policy and Quality and Senate Assistant Secretary presented the report (010-S210922, Protected) summarising the direction of travel across the range of policy areas subject to regulation by the Office for Students (OfS).</p> <p>Guided by the questions posed in the paper, Senators participated in a facilitated discussion on the overarching challenges and opportunities presented by the OfS' evolving approach to areas of policy in the Senate's remit, with contributions from colleagues working directly on the University's response, under the following themes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Equality of Opportunity • Student Outcomes: Baselines, Grade Inflation, OfS/QAA • Freedom of Speech and Academic Freedom • Future flexible provision and the funding landscape <p>The following points were raised as part of discussion feedback:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • [Exempt information not included].

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The complexities around the interplay of freedom of speech and increased community engagement were highlighted. It was acknowledged that early discussions and a robust code for Academic Freedom and Freedom of Expression would help mitigate against any potential threats. • While grade inflation was within the University's remit to control, a process could usefully be developed to monitor and track trends in mark and intake data, for example. Granularity of data would also be helpful. • Robustness and visibility of data would also be essential in work on equality of opportunity. Looking at aggregate numbers, not ignoring the level of detail and avoiding meeting minimum thresholds were all highlighted as points of note. • Consideration should be given to the format and length of reports and published information available for students, including that relating to support, to ensure transparency and ease of accessibility. <p>It was noted that the discussions would inform the decisions taken by the Senate through the coming year.</p>
