Ekaterina Zhuravskaya

Ekaterina Zhuravskaya is a Professor of Economics at the Paris School of Economics and the École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales (EHESS) in Paris, as well as a coeditor of the *American Economic Review*. She is also a Research Fellow at CEPR, affiliated with its Political Economy and Development Economics programs. Zhuravskaya earned her PhD in Economics from Harvard University in 1999 and has since held various academic and advisory positions.

Her work has significantly advanced the understanding of how political institutions, media, and economic policies shape societies. Her research spans topics such as the political effects of media and, more recently, social media, the origins of ethnic conflict, historical economic development, corruption, and decentralization.

Throughout her career, she has received numerous prestigious honors, including the Birgit Grodahl Award, the CNRS Silver Medal, the Gamow Award, a fellowship with the Econometric Society, and foreign honorary membership in the American Economic Association.
