Joining Warwick's Learning Program

There is one way to join Warwick's Learning Program on Coursera and this is done by:

 Clicking through the unique Program
URL (you will have received this) and signing into Coursera using your official Warwick email address ending .warwick.ac.uk or .wbs.ac.uk


Note: Please note that this is different from visiting coursera.org and signing up as a new user. Doing so will mean that you are using Coursera's consumer site and not Warwick's learning program, and hence you will not be able to enjoy the enterprise benefits.

Joining Warwick's Learning Program

Once you click on the unique program URL that you will have received, you will be directed to your faculty's learning program.

In order to join, you need to first log in to the Coursera platform.

To do so, click on "**Join for Free**" or the "**Log In**" button in the top right corner.




Note: Please note that if you are already logged into Coursera with the same email address on which you have been invited for this program, you will directly see "Join Program" button

Create your account

Once you click on "Join for Free", you'll be directed to **Welcome to Coursera** page where you will have 2 options for account setup:

- A) If you don't have an existing Coursera account, select "I'm a new Coursera user"
- B) If you do have an existing Coursera account (either using your Warwick email previously or a different personal email), select "I'm an existing Coursera user". This is critical to keeping all of your past/future accomplishments and progress in one place.



Note - Please note that if you have accessed the program link before you will not see the "Welcome to Coursera" page - you will directly see the pop up to login with your account or sign up for a new account to access the learning program.

Create your account


- A. If you select "I am an existing Coursera user", you will land on the first screen where you will be asked to enter your existing set of username and password. Once done, your existing account will be linked to your new email.
- B. If you select "I am a new Coursera user", you will land on the second screen where you will be asked to create a password for your new account

Enrolling in a Course




Choose your course

After you create a new Coursera account or log in with an existing Coursera account, you'll be taken to the program home page.

Click on the **Catalog** tab to browse the courses selected for your program. Once you have chosen a course that interests you, click on the course tile to access the course details.

You can only choose 1 course but you also enrol on an unlimited number of Guided Projects - you can change your mind within 14 days of enrolling!






Enroll in course

The course description page has detailed information to help **your enrollment decision**.

The description includes:

- Skills that you will gain
- Level
- Workload
- Rating
- Detailed syllabus

If you decide to enroll, click on the "**Enroll for free**" button – it will then change to "**Go To Course**". Once you enter the course, you can start watching videos and taking quizzes immediately.




Note: While most courses are on-demand and learner can start learning immediately, there are a few courses that have a specific start date. While you can enroll in these courses at any time, you will have to wait for the session to begin learning.

Starting a Course

Go to your course

After you enroll in a course, it will show under the **My Courses** tab on your program home page. Click on **Resume** or **Preview** on the right to enter the course.

You can also get to your course under the **Catalog** tab on your program page. Navigate to the class tile, click into it, and then click on **Go to Course**.



Access course materials

When you enroll in a course, you will be taken to the Course Page. The course will be broken down by weeks in the left navigation bar, and links to assignments, videos, and readings will appear in the right fields.

Click on **Start** to access the first module in the course.

Click on **Resume** to return to a course to start where you last left off.

The **Resume** button takes you back to where you last left off—even if it was in the middle of a watching a video.



Resetting Deadlines

Reset Deadlines: Start/due dates are suggested to keep you on track—you can reset if things get busy (you will be prompted to do so).

You can do so by clicking on the Reset Deadlines option either from: 1) In-course page 2) Program home page

3) Unenroll from a course : This option is available only within 14 days of enrollment. Please unenroll within this window if you don't plan to continue with the course, especially if you have enrollment limits.

- Retake quizzes and assignments from this page if you need to improve a score or if you did not pass the first time.



Discussion forums are accessed through the left-hand menu on your course page. These are available for most courses.






Accessing a Guided Project

Choose your Guided Project

Guided Projects allow Learners to use a pre-configured cloud desktop that is accessible from their web browser to learn a new tool by completing instructor-led tasks.

You can find all the projects by typing in "Rhyme" in the search bar.Once you have chosen a project that interests you, click on the project tile to access the details and click on the "**Enroll**" button for access.





Note: Guided Projects need to be accessed via a desktop or a laptop


Access Guided Projects

When you enroll in a guided project, you will be taken to the Course Page. The course will consist of modules in the left navigation bar –look for **External Tool** assignment to access the project exercise

Click on **"Open Tool"** to access the guided project interface

Other lessons in the module such as reading material help you gain a better understanding of the Project.

To obtain a certificate for the completed guided project, come back to the course page after finishing the project and pass the quiz.



You can access your certificates of completion under the **Accomplishments** option from the dropdown in top-right corner, displaying your name.








Learner Support
