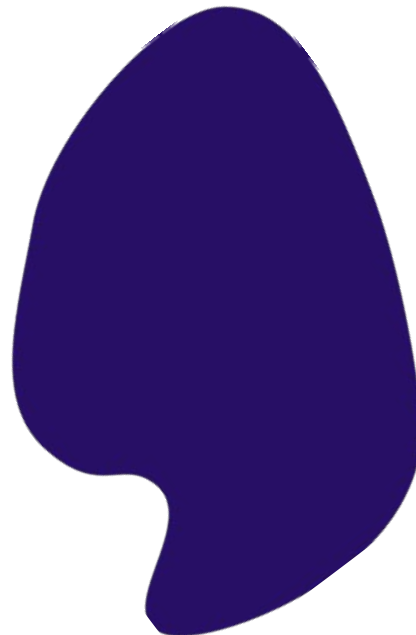
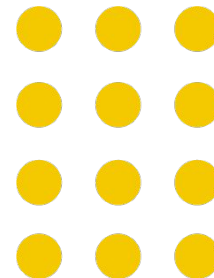


Joining Warwick's Learning Program

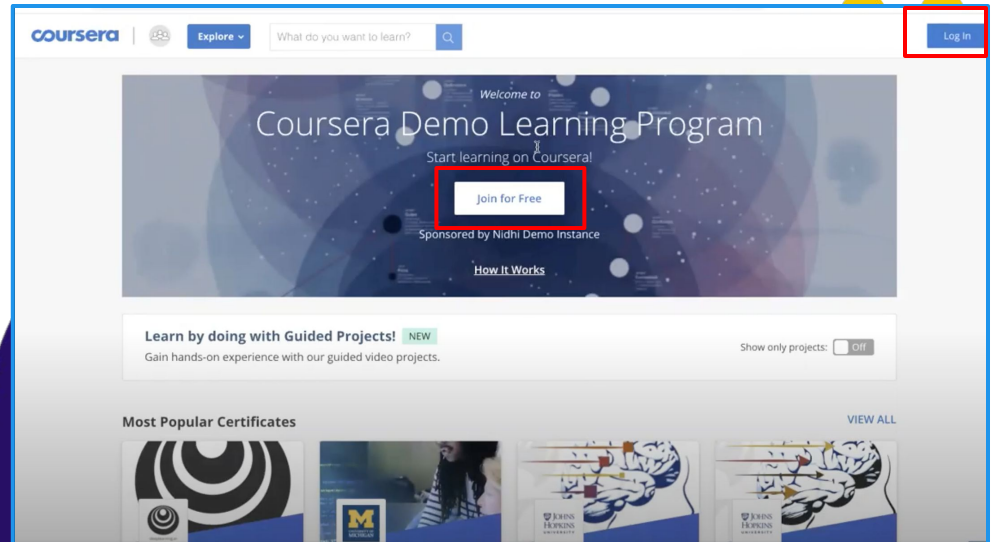

Joining Warwick's Learning Program

Once you click on the unique program URL that you will have received, you will be directed to your faculty's learning program.

In order to join, you need to first log in to the Coursera platform.

To do so, click on **"Join for Free"** or the **"Log In"** button in the top right corner.

Create your account

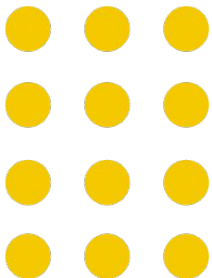
Starting a Course

Access Guided Projects

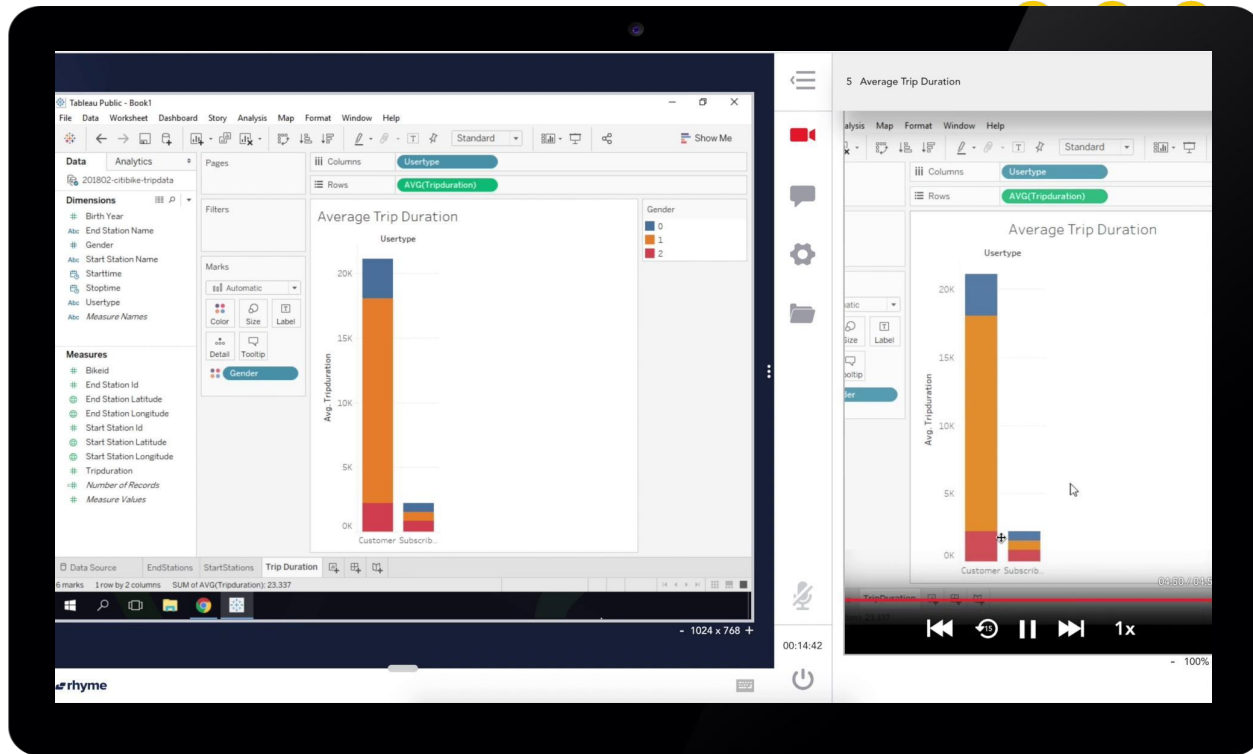



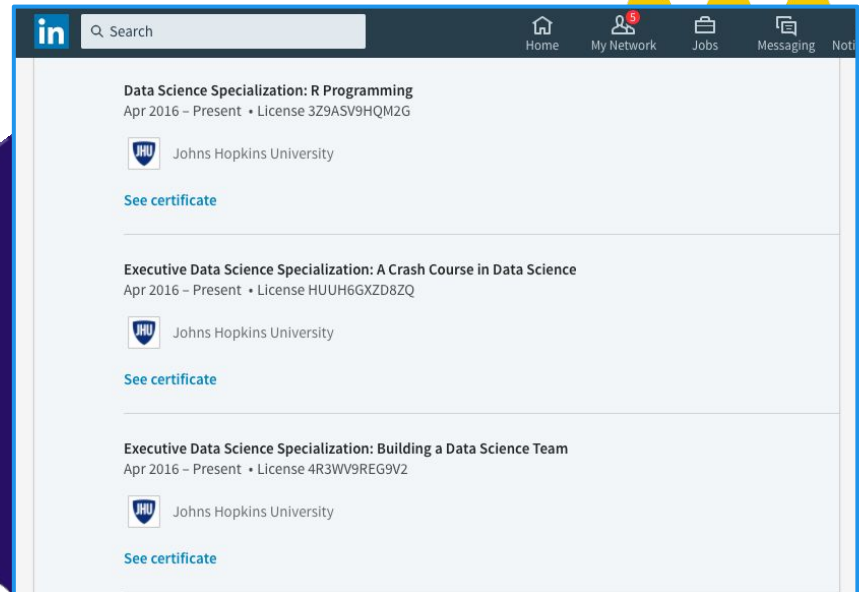
