### JSPS Summer Programme.

Application deadline: Tuesday 15th January 2013—Fellowship to take place during fixed period of 11 June to 21 august 2013.

Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) is the leading research funding agency in Japan, established by the Japanese Government for the purpose of contributing to the advancement of science. Our Summer Programme provides the opportunity for pre and post-doctoral researchers to receive an orientation on Japanese culture and research systems and to conduct collaborative research activities with leading research groups at Japanese universities and research institutions over a period of 2 months during the summer.

**Value of award:** Return international airfare, maintenance allowance (534,000 JPY), domestic research trip allowance (58,500 JPY) and overseas travel and accident insurance policy are provided.

**Eligibility:** Applicants need to be a UK national or permanent resident and should be of graduate student status (Master or PhD) or be a recent PhD holder (within the last 6 years) and should be based at a UK university or research institution. Eligible research fields are not limited.
