About Export Controls: UK

- Restrict the export & communication of sensitive technology & strategic goods
- Prevent WMD proliferation & counter international threats inc. terrorism
- Applies to export of
 - Physical goods: Samples, equipment, materials, parts, laptops etc.
 - Technology & information: Data, knowledge, know-how



Academic activities that could be subject to Export Control

- Research on behalf of an international partner
- International collaboration
- Presentations at conferences
- Export of materials
- Teaching
- Academic exchange with a colleague at an overseas institution





Post Brexit research environment

- UK Government plans for 'Global Britain' has science at its core
 - 'International Research & Innovation Strategy' 2019
 - 'UK R&D Road Map' 2020
 - 'Global Britain in a Competitive Age: Integrated Review of Security, Defence, Development & Foreign Policy, 2021
- Place science at the centre of international relations
- Build research partnerships with emerging economies
- **Co-produce research** with external partners to address real-world challenges





An increasingly regulated environment

- Driven by US Gov. c/cerns wrt economic power & influence of China
- Increased emphasis on regulation
- UK Export Control Joint Unit: moving from support to audit phase
- Think-tanks/media:
 - Inadvertently Arming China? Civitas, February 2021
 - The China Question: KCL & Harvard Kennedy School (Jo Johnson)
 - Intense US media coverage of 200 cases of IP theft
 - UK media now following suit
- February 2020: Updated 'Trusted Research' guidance issued by CPNI





Sanctions

- A breach of UK Export Controls can be a criminal offence
- Sanctions apply to individual researchers & institution
- Accidental non-compliance followed by voluntary disclosure: civil penalties
- Knowingly exporting without a licence: criminal offence
- Unlimited fines
- Prison sentence up to a maximum of 10 years
- **2021:** Princeton University settles with BIS for unlicensed exports of pathogens
- Potential negative impact on research partnerships & major funders undermine confidence



UK National Security & Investment Bill

- Progressed to HoL in January 2021
- Radical up-grade of the UK foreign investment regime
- Introduces a stand-alone national security regime
- Mandatory notification of transactions in sensitive sectors
- Voluntary notification in other
- 'Call in' power
- enable Gov to review non-notified transactions **5 years post completion**
- Serious sanctions for non-compliance
- Captures a wide range of transactions including IP





Work underway

- Research
 - New Export Control questions added to IDeATE & internal ethics forms in collaboration with academic departments
 - **Retrospective projects work** Science departments
 - Comprehensive webpages and guidance notes: <u>https://warwick.ac.uk/services/ris/export-controls/</u>
- Institution
 - Export control working group to develop an institutional policy and associated training materials
 - Supplemented with working instructions and SOPs at level of individual departments/specific areas
- Specialist Export Control consultant engaged: 'David Hayes Export Controls'
