

Video presentation requirements

All EURSS projects, once completed, must be presented in the form of:

- a 10-minute recorded PowerPoint presentation

OR

- an alternative form of presentation (creative project, virtual poster, photo-essay, podcast, etc.), **with approval from the first supervisor.**

Each participant is also required to submit a 500-word reflective essay alongside their presentation.

Presentation guidelines

- Your presentation must be 10 minutes long and stored in one of the following file formats: mp4, mov, mpeg, mpg or avi.
- The first slide in the presentation should include your name(s), home university, academic department(s), project title and the names and universities of your supervisors.
- You should include sections on introduction/background, methodology, findings/results, and conclusions, although they do not have to be titled like this. Also include references and acknowledgements (both in smaller print). You should avoid jargon.
- You should acknowledge the EURSS and that of any other organisation you have worked with in your presentation. We would prefer that you use one of the templates provided to incorporate the EUTOPIA branding. Templates will be shared with successful applicants.
- If you think there may be Intellectual Property (IP) issues arising from your research, please discuss this with your supervisors and then alert the EURSS team. This may affect what you can include in your presentation and whether it can be displayed at the virtual showcase.

Alternative presentation guidelines

If you intend to present your project through an alternative presentation (creative project, virtual poster, photo-essay, podcast, etc.), you must obtain written approval from your first supervisor. Your first supervisor should send this approval, including a brief outline of the presentation method to be used to warwickineurope@warwick.ac.uk

Group projects

Members of a group project should collaborate to produce a single 10-minute recorded PowerPoint presentation, or a single alternative presentation (creative project, etc.).

Groups may divide responsibilities as they see fit, but each member of the group should submit a 500-word essay. These essays may focus on the same area of the project, but must be obviously individual; or they may focus on different aspects of the project so that together they give a full account of the work done by the group.

The reflective essays will be combined into a single document for each group and made available alongside the presentations at the EURSS virtual showcase.

Reflective essay

All EURSS participants – including individual members of group projects – should accompany their presentation with a 500-word reflective essay. Your reflective essay should address:

- the background, methodology, findings, and conclusions of the project (as you understand them)
- the ways in which you benefitted from carrying out the project

AND, if applicable:

- the nature of your contribution to the group project and presentation
- your reasons for presenting your project through an alternative presentation.

Further guidance will be provided to successful EURSS applicants.

Virtual showcase

Presentations will be showcased in a EURSS event in **November 2021**. This showcase will be designed to accommodate the various presentation methods used by participants. Staff and students from all six EUTOPIA universities will be invited to attend.
