

Examples of Misconduct

The examples below do not imply a parity of severity. They include examples of the types of misconduct that will be dealt with under Regulation 23. Some of these examples of misconduct may also be dealt with under Regulation 27.

Discrimination

Including, but not limited to: hate incidents, racism, antisemitism, islamophobia, discrimination due to gender reassignment, disability, sex, religion or any other protected characteristic.

Breaches of the Dignity at Warwick policy.

Conduct

Including, but not limited to: refusal to respond to reasonable requests by University staff, antisocial behaviour, damage to property, persistent or multiple breaches of University regulations, impersonation of others / false pretences, assault, affray, threatening behaviour, offensive behaviour, indecent behaviour, disorderly conduct, harassment, bullying, stalking, conduct bringing the University into disrepute, conduct interfering with the normal operation of University or failure to complete sanctions imposed by a Discipline Committee.

Health & Safety

Including, but not limited to: tampering with fire safety equipment, malicious activation of fire alarms, arson, smoking in prohibited areas, ignoring fire alarms, other conduct putting others at risk.

Academic

Including, but not limited to: bribery, plagiarism, falsification or misuse of University records (including degree or diploma certificates), misconduct in connection with examinations, uploading academic materials (including, but not limited to lecture notes) to websites or platforms for dishonest or fraudulent purposes.

Theft/Fraud

Including, but not limited to: theft, fraud, deception for financial gain or extortion.

Criminal Offences/ Illegal substances

Any offences against the criminal law, where these offences involve other students or directly affect the interests of the University, including possession, use or supply of illegal substances.

Offences under Other University Regulations

Including, but not limited to breaches of the Online and Social Media Policy or parking offences.

Sexual misconduct
