

How to Find a Short-Term Mobility Experience

Step 1: Start with Research

Begin by exploring what kind of short-term mobility experience would suit you best. Think about:

- Your academic interests
- Where you would like to go
- How long you want to be away for
- What type of experience you are looking for
- Your Budget
- All short-term mobility should take place outside your teaching period - term time.
- Follow us @warwickstudyabroad – watch inspiring reels from students showcasing their experiences in study, volunteering, and work placements across the globe.

Step 2: Come to Go Global Fair

This event is held in November and is your go-to event for short-term mobility opportunities.

Here you can:

- talk directly to providers.
- meet student ambassadors who can share their experiences.
- ask questions and compare your options.

If you are just starting your search, this is the best place to begin.

Step 3: Sign Up to Our Monthly Mailing List

Receive our monthly newsletter and stay up to date with the latest opportunities.

Highlights will include:

- new short-term mobility options
- Webinar Information Sessions from our providers
- opportunities with tuition and boarding waiver (via a competitive application process)
- available funding support
- other important updates and deadlines

This is one of the easiest ways to keep informed throughout the year.

Step 4: Attend the Spring Fair

If you need a reminder or missed the Global Showcase, our Spring Fair is a great follow-up event.

It is a smaller-scale refresher where you can:

- revisit your options.
- ask further questions.
- get guidance if you are ready to decide

Step 5: The Global Portal

Our Global Portal brings all short-term mobility opportunities together in one place.

You can use the portal filters to drill down into the options that matter most to you, such as:

- destination
- duration
- provider
- type of programme

This makes it easier to find opportunities that match your priorities.

Step 6: Consider the Costs

When choosing an opportunity, it is important to think carefully about your budget.

Even where there are reduced tuition fees through one of our providers, you will still usually need to budget for:

- return travel/transfers.
- Insurance
- accommodation
- food
- personal spending

Make sure you understand the full cost of the experience before applying.

Step 7: Funding

Details of funding for short-term mobility opportunities will be confirmed in the Spring Term. Our webpage will be updated then to provide information on eligibility, application deadlines, and the application process.

Please be aware that any funding that becomes available will be limited and typically awarded on a competitive basis, so it is not guaranteed. Any funding offered will normally be a contribution towards the cost of your experience rather than full financial support.

Step 8: Benefits of a short-term international experience

Higher Education Achievement Report (HEAR) - By letting us know about your experience, we can ensure it is recorded on your HEAR, recognising your international experience as part of your Warwick Journey.

Warwick Award – You claim 10 points for a short-term international activity.
