	We have set the GPA and English proficiency requirements as
	guidelines rather than absolute requirements. Therefore, we will be
	very flexible according to each student's circumstances.
	We expect some of our partner institutions may face problems when
	converting students' GPA and English proficiency scores to our
	requirements, in such cases we accept the student's application as
	long as the home university determines the student meets our
	requirements (we do not require any letters issued by home
