Available Courses for exchange students	<p>Rikkyo University offers more than 4,000 courses to exchange students from all the colleges and graduate schools(except some graduate schools), including about 500 courses conducted in English. Most of courses are available to all exhchage student. Please be advised that there are some courses that can only be offered to students who belong to the college or graduate school, or courses with limited enrollment. Also, to take Japanese language courses, students must have a language level of J6 or higher in the Japanese language placement test. Japanese Language Courses	<p>Students must be enrolled in the level in which they are placed based on the results of the Japanese language placement test given during the orientation. Transcripts	<p>Transcripts are sent to home universities in the following manner:  For exchange students who complete their studies in Fall semester (January): Transcripts are sent to home universities <b>in early April.</b>  For exchange students who complete their studies in Spring semester (July): Transcripts are sent to home universities <b>in early September.</b>  Please note that requests to expedite the issuance of transcripts will not be considered unless we have a specific agreement with our partner institutions.</p>

## Application

Required level of Language Proficiency/Language Requirements	<p>In order to take regular academic courses offered in Japanese, it is recommended that the students pass <b><u>Lv6 or above</u></b> in the Japanese placement exam, which students need to take after their arrival at Rikkyo.</p> <p>If students wish to take part in the Japanese language courses of J1 level or higher, they are expected to have mastered <i>hiragana</i> and <i>katakana</i> prior to their arrival at Rikkyo.</p>	
Application procedures	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students must submit the application to their home institution to participate in the exchange program.</li> <li>Upon receiving the recommendation from the home university, the students can submit the application to Rikkyo University.</li> <li>Rikkyo University reviews the applications and allocates the students to appropriate colleges, graduate schools or Center for Japanese Language Education. After the students' admission is confirmed, Certificate of Eligibility is issued and mailed to the student.</li> </ol>

## Visa

Student ( <i>Ryugaku</i> ) Visa	Incoming students receive a Certificate of Eligibility after their admittance to Rikkyo and must apply for a student visa at the nearby Japanese Embassy / Consulate. Those who have Japanese citizenship (including dual citizenship) do not need to apply for a student visa.
Residence Card	Newly arrived international students will be issued a “Residence Card” upon their arrival and must report their residential address in Japan to a nearby city/ward office.
Part-Time Job Permission	International Students may apply for part-time work permission ( <i>Shikakugai Katsudo Kyoka</i> , 資格外活動許可) at the time of their arrival in Japan.

## Medical insurance

National Health Insurance Plan (required)	Rikkyo University mandates all the Special International Students (including exchange students) to join the Japanese National Health Insurance regardless of the length of their stay at Rikkyo. The students need to complete the application for the insurance at a nearby city/ward office after their arrival in Japan. The National Plan covers approximately 70% of total medical costs incurred. Students need to pay the monthly premium (the amount of fees differs depending on each city/ward).
Rikkyo University Student Mutual-Aid Health Care Union (optional)	The Student Health Insurance Plan covers approximately 30% of total medical costs incurred if the monthly medical cost exceeds 2,500 yen. Combined with the National Plan, the Student Plan offers supplemental coverage in order to reduce the financial burden on students in case of illness or injury. <u>Please keep in mind that the Student Plan does not extend coverage to dental care.</u> While it is no longer mandated for all incoming exchange students, we strongly recommend students join the plan if they plan to study for two semesters or longer.

### Estimated Budget/Expenses/Living Cost (one academic year, 11 months)

Tuition	Waived (Note: Students may have to bear tuition costs in the case that the home university sends more students than the agreed number of exchange slots to Rikkyo, depending on the exchange balance.)

### The ACE Program (2021~)

Rikkyo University has signed a collaborative agreement with several of the Asia region's leading universities – specifically, the College of Liberal Studies, Seoul National University; Yuanpei College, Peking University; and the University Scholars Programme, National University of Singapore – to form a consortium for international educational collaboration, with the aim of working together to develop liberal arts education in the East Asia and ASEAN regions.
