

- **You will be based in School of Modern Languages and Cultures / Italian section** and this will be your Home Department.
- Please note that **not all modules are available to Erasmus students**; they are subject to availability, and require a pre-enrolment. **All modules will be chosen and confirmed on arrival; we cannot guarantee the availability of any module at this stage.**
- All students based at Italian department will be expected to take other modules within the School of Modern Languages and Cultures (generally 75% of the workload, although there may be exceptions upon approval of other departments) and/or within the Arts Faculty upon approval of other relevant Departments. If you wish to take a module from a department outside the Faculty of Arts (e.g. Economics, PAIS, WBS, Law, IATL) you will have to contact the other department yourself to ascertain module availability.

The webpage has been updated with 2018/19 modules, and you should contact the module tutor to ascertain whether there are any available places.
- Please note that students will only be allowed to take **1 (one, 30 CATS) English and Comparative Literary Studies** module. Due to specific restraints only suitably qualified students will be accepted. All relevant information is available <http://www2.warwick.ac.uk/fac/arts/english/currentstudents/visiting/>. In doubt, please contact single module tutors.
- It is useful if you indicate before your arrival if you wish to study a **Linguistics** module, although confirmation cannot take place before the second week of term. Students interested in second year Linguistics or Sociolinguistics modules should contact Cheryl Toogod (C.Toogod@warwick.ac.uk) and provide some details of relevant training/Linguistics modules in their home institution.
- It is useful if you indicate before arrival if you wish to study a **History** module, in order to secure a place. You should contact Andrea Humber (A.E.Humber@warwick.ac.uk) about this.
- Students are required to take modules up to a **MAXIMUM** of:
 - Full year students 120 CATs
 - Autumn Only 40 CATs
 - Autumn and Spring Terms 96 CATs
 - Spring Only 40 CATs
 - Spring and Summer Terms 72 CATs
 You will not be allowed to take more than the above CATs.
- These notes generally apply to undergraduate nominations. Please note that, normally, students who are taking *laurea magistrale* may only take undergraduate modules, and MA modules are permitted only for exceptional reasons and upon approval from the Department. Please bear in mind that enrolling as a Postgraduate Erasmus may result in later delivery for your transcript of records.
