Be aware of SCAMS

PROTECT YOURSELF AND YOUR MONEY

A scam is an attempt by a criminal fraudster to steal your money (a 'scammer').

Scammers often pretend to be from an **authority** such as a bank, the Tax Office, the Home Office, the University or the Police (UK Police or Police from your home country).

Find out more



Scammers may contact you by **phone call, text message, WhatsApp, email** or other apps and channels. Their phone number or email address may appear genuine – it may be identical to the real number of the organisation they are claiming to call from.

Scammers often express **urgency** and try to **pressure** you to make payments and provide personal details. Scams are increasingly sophisticated and persuasive; they are experts at appearing official and genuine.

In the following cases, please **stop, think and seek** advice: **If unsure, speak with a staff member**

- If you are contacted unexpectedly
- If you are asked for your bank account details
- If you are asked to transfer money or make payments
- If you are pressured or asked to make an immediate decision
- If you are told you have broken rules
- If you are asked for personal information
- If you are asked not to tell other people

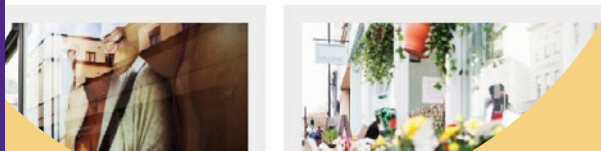

Yep, you should! To use the NHS, you need to register with a GP (doctor) – even just to book an appointment.

On campus?

Register at the Uni Health Centre uwhc.org.uk

Off campus?

Find a local GP nhs.uk/service-search/find-a-gp

Once you're signed up, you can get appointments, prescriptions, and support for your health – both physical and mental.

Okay... but what if I feel ill – do I always need to see a doctor?

Not feeling great?

For minor stuff like sore throats or UTIs, skip the GP – go to a pharmacy instead.

We are a friendly team who take your health very seriously. We want to ensure you have easy access to healthcare and the support you need whilst studying at university.

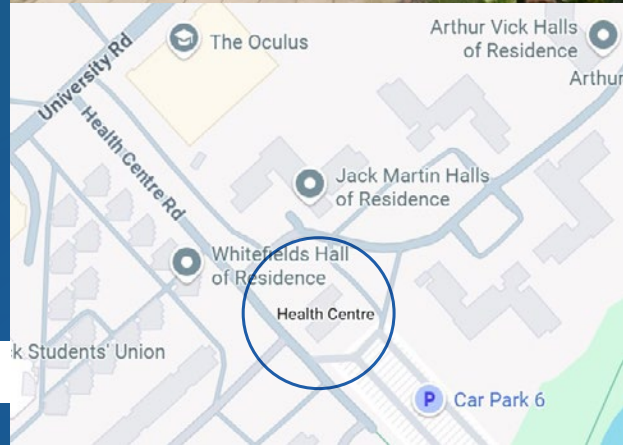
If you are a student living on campus or within the catchment area we encourage you to register with our campus-based NHS health centre.

These are the key activities relevant to you:

1. 'Student Conduct: What you need to know' Moodle

You'll receive an email to your Warwick email account with the link to this Moodle in early September. It's mandatory for all first-year students and packed with practical information to support your journey. Please complete it before term starts.

The Moodle will help you to:

- Settle in smoothly with tips for positive conduct from day one
- Understand your rights and responsibilities as part of our community
- Build respectful friendships and relationships, with a focus on consent and respect
- Navigate digital spaces safely and responsibly
- Know where to turn for support if you need it

2. Departmental Student Conduct Session.

Your department will schedule the 'Student Conduct: Looking out for yourself and your friends' session into your timetable during Term 1. The session covers key conduct-related topics and offers practical tips to help you look after yourself and others. Understanding how your behaviour impacts those around you is a key part of succeeding at Warwick.

3. Two Micro-learning Courses (which you can do on your phone!)

You'll get the link to the 'Consent at Warwick' and the 'Anti-bullying and harassment' micro-learning courses directly to your phone (and Warwick email) in Term 1. Each course takes only 7 to 9 minutes covering topics directly related to your student experience. It's quick, clear and easy to use. Plus, you get to rate the course at the end, so your feedback counts too. Tap the link and make change.

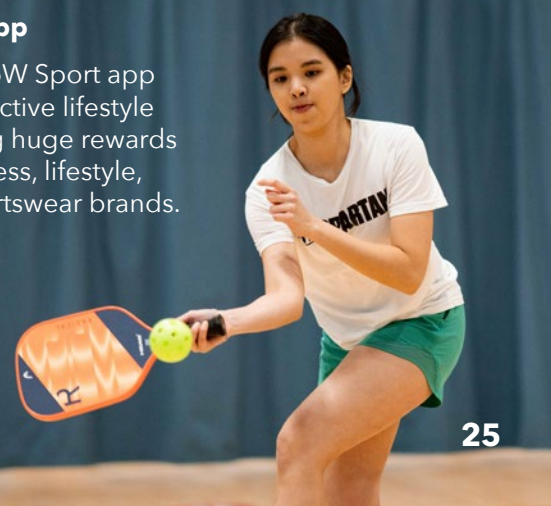

Remember, your first year is a developmental learning journey. University style teaching and learning is very different - it will take some time to get used to it and that is ok. Everyone in first year is in the same position and experiencing a new academic environment for the first time.

Your Personal Tutor

What is a Personal Tutor?

Your personal tutor is an accessible, approachable academic member of staff assigned to you from your home department. They are your first point of contact for any issues, questions or concerns you have about your studies.

How do I know who my Personal Tutor is?

You can find out the name and email address of your personal tutor on Tabula. However, if you're a WBS student, you can find out these details on MyWBS.

What can they support me with?

Your personal tutor is there to help you navigate all aspects of life at university - whether that's providing academic guidance or signposting you to more specialised central support services.

Don't forget to let your Personal Tutor know about any extra-curricular activities you do. This helps them get to know you a little better. It's also something they can draw on later when writing references for you.

Don't be afraid to ask questions!

They can:

- Support you with the transition from school to university.
- Suggest ways to get involved in the department and wider university.
- Offer advice on how to develop your academic performance.
- Help you understand the academic feedback you receive.
- Signpost you to health and wellbeing support services.
- Supply references to support applications for jobs and further study.

How often do I meet them?

You will meet your personal tutor approximately once per term for a general check-in, but you can arrange to meet them more often if you prefer.

How do I prepare for a personal tutor meeting?

It's a good idea to be proactive and think about what you'd like to discuss. Here's a few suggestions to get you started:

- How is your learning experience developing?
- Do you have any questions about your modules, or your studies in general?
- What are you looking to get out of each stage of your studies?
- Which skills would you like to develop at university?
- Do you have any questions about employability?
- Are there any other issues affecting your studies, such as accommodation or finances?

5 TOP TIPS TO SUPPORT YOUR ACADEMIC TRANSITION

- 1. Ask questions**
 Reach out to staff if you're confused or struggling - they are here to help.
- 2. Plan ahead**
 Make a timetable once you get your term dates and module confirmations. University involves a lot of independent study, so account for this in your planning.
- 3. Organise your notes**
 Decide how you'll take and organise notes (notebook, laptop, filing system). This will come in handy, especially in the lead up to submission deadlines.
- 4. Learn platforms**
 Get familiar with the online platforms such as Tabula/Moodle/MyWarwick etc. The more confident you are at navigating them, the smoother your first few weeks will be!
- 5. Get involved**
 Engage with extra opportunities within your department and beyond! Whether this is volunteering, skills workshops, mentoring schemes, employability sessions, paid work or socials. There are so many ways to get involved with the Warwick community and make your time at uni as fulfilling as possible.

JARGON BUSTER

Some words and phrases looking unfamiliar? Don't panic! Have a look at our handy jargon buster below...

Lecture

An oral presentation to teach you about a particular topic. Lecture styles will vary between different academics, but traditionally, a lecture is a presentation during which you will listen and take notes.

Seminar

A smaller group teaching session, where you can exchange thoughts and ideas. The exact format and size of these will depend on your course.

Tutorial

A meeting with your personal tutor (or other nominated member of staff) to discuss your progress, or a specific module/assignment.

CAT

Stands for the Credit Accumulation and Transfer Scheme. This refers to the number of credits you receive for each module on your course. Every student must take a minimum of 120 CATs each year of study. Your department will advise you on the modules and CATs available to you in your first year.

Contact hours

The hours spent in timetabled teaching. In other words, the amount of time you spend learning in contact with your department (e.g. lectures/seminars), as opposed to your own independent study.

Office hours

Each member of staff will have nominated office hours, during which they should be available for informal discussions around academic support/ issues you're facing on a particular module etc. Office hours will usually be displayed outside the door, or on your department's website/handbook.

Formative

An assignment which is graded but doesn't count towards your final grade for the year.

Summative

A graded assessment which does count towards your end of year mark.

Undergraduate

A student who is studying towards their first degree. Undergraduate courses usually take between 3-4 years.

Postgraduate

A student who has already completed their first degree and has progressed onto a more advanced course (either a Masters or Doctorate).

WELCOME TO THE Library

The Library is a very important part of your academic journey. But it can also be very intimidating, so here are some tips and tricks from fellow students to help you get started!

Quick Information Guide

1. Get to grips with the Library with a tour

The Library tour was useful as it showed you the various areas of the building, and the process of finding, collecting and returning books.

Tours run throughout Welcome Week and can be booked via the Welcome Week Timetable or you can pick up a self-guided tour map and do the tour in your own time!

2. Explore the Library website

There is more to the website than just the Library Search so make sure you explore beyond the books, scroll beyond the search bar and make time to click around.

That being said, exploring Library Search is also recommended. You can filter your searches from the side bar, use brackets and quotation marks in searches and use the options button as an advanced search.

3. Learn to navigate the shelves

Each floor has different subject areas, separated by classmarks.

To find the book on the shelves, work on each part of the classmark at a time. (i.e. (HD) (540.3) (G) ((0.)74).)

This then works in an alphabetical and numerical order.

You can also use the Library's interactive maps to easily find books based on classmark.



4. Don't be afraid to ask for help

Ask for help. The Helpdesk staff are very friendly and help with all sorts of issues. Plus, if you are feeling stuck or need more resources, reach out to the Research & Academic Support Librarians. They are the experts and genuinely saved me time when I needed better references or search strategies.

5. Check out all the digital offerings

Discovering that there was more than just books and e-books was a game changer for me. There are databases and journals too. Then there are the Library Online Courses which are full of incredibly helpful courses, especially for international students.

6. Find the perfect spot for you

For some, silence is golden. For others, they can't stand working in absolute silence.

With collaboration areas on floors 1 and 2, quiet floors on floor 3 and up, a silent study room and a sensory study room on floor 2 extension, the Library has study spaces for your exact needs.



7. Discover the Accessible Library

If you are registered with Disability Services you can book accessible study rooms in the Library - an oasis of automatic doors, adjustable tables and chairs, whiteboards, and a suite of accessible study software.

There are also loanable items like ear defenders, coloured overlays and more to help make the Library accessible to all.



9. Follow the Library on Instagram

I found out about so many resources that I didn't know existed through the Library's Instagram, it's been so helpful to my studies.

Warwick Award: SHOWCASE YOUR SKILLS

The Warwick Award helps you to build, reflect and get recognition for the skills you gain both in and outside of your course of study. Our top tip is to **register as soon as you can** and use the platform to identify the skills you want to improve, and the activities you can do to enhance these skills.

Reflect on your activities in the Warwick Award's reflective portfolio to gain Core Skills Points – collect enough points and receive an institutionally recognised Warwick Award, a line on your degree transcript, and a certificate to share with employers that will help you stand out.

Core skills

The Warwick Award is structured around **12 Core Employability Skills** which employers have told us they value in graduate employees – by completing the portfolio, you'll be able to confidently show employers the skills you've developed.

The Core Skills you'll develop through the Award are Critical thinking; Problem solving; Teamwork; Digital Literacy; Information literacy; Professionalism; Intercultural awareness; Ethical values; Self-awareness; Organisational awareness; Communication; Sustainability.

Since the Award launched in autumn 2022, **over 2000 students have gained a Warwick Award** and had their commitment to activities that develop the 12 crucial employability skills recognised. This year, we look forward to welcoming even more Warwick Award participants, and we hope you will be one of them!

If you're seeking an international experience during your time at Warwick, there are various options to suit your interests.

Study Abroad

Whilst studying at Warwick, you can access opportunities to study abroad, allowing you to immerse yourself in another culture, explore new places, and often learn a new language, all while continuing your studies.

Warwick works with top-ranked, global university partners to offer places for our students to study abroad for a full year or possibly one semester.

Talk to the Student Mobility Team or your department about your options at the start of your second year.

Short-term Mobility

If you would like to try an international experience over a shorter period, you could try a short-term overseas experience.

These experiences usually take place outside of term time, and do not extend your course length, offering flexibility and a taste of international exposure.

Short-term experiences include international study programmes such as summer schools, work, volunteering, or research projects - all of which can fit around your degree.

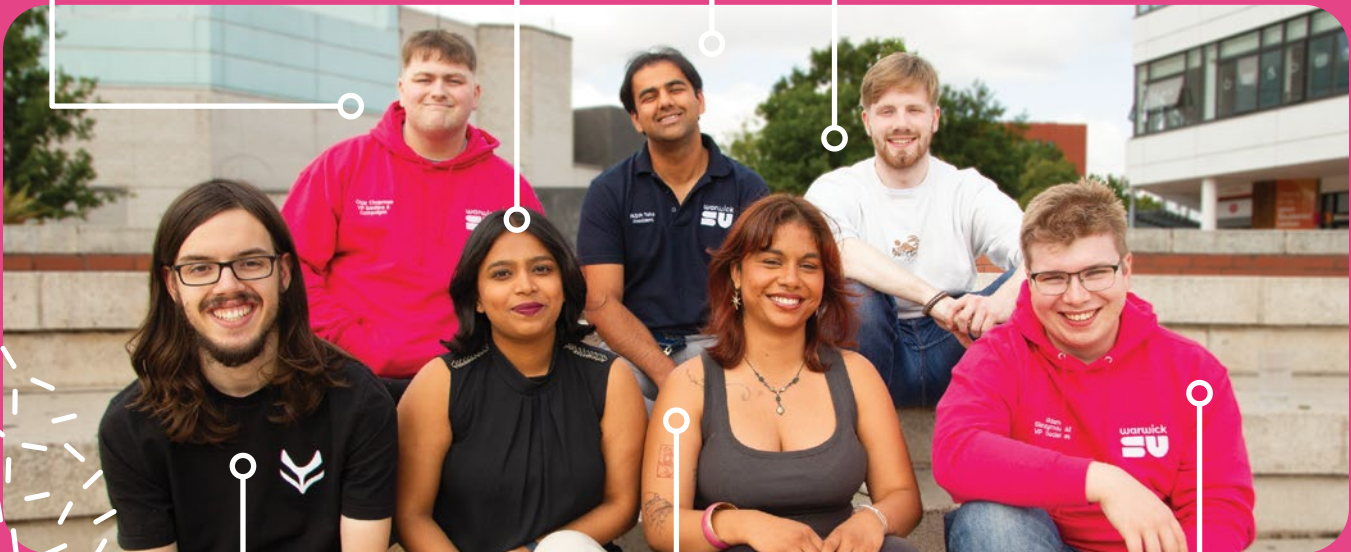
