Why Warwick



Warwick attracts students from all around the world due to our reputation for offering a high quality education. Students are provided with the opportunity to learn from experts and to become an expert in their own right.



Why the UK

The UK has a very long history of providing an excellent standard of education and is home to some of the world's top universities.

The UK has maintained the high quality of its degrees with a standard that is government-guaranteed. A UK degree is world-recognised and desired by employers across the globe which means obtaining a degree from a renowned and well-respected UK university can improve a student's employment prospects. During their time at Warwick, students will develop key skills and attributes which are transferable to the workplace, such as analytical thinking, research, communication and reasoning.

Learning in an English-speaking country, surrounded by students from many different cultures and backgrounds, provides scholars with a global perspective and international outlook.

For many sponsors and scholars, one of the most appealing aspects of study in the UK is the number of years it takes to obtain a degree. Unlike many countries, where a Bachelor's degree may take four years or more, in England most students complete their Bachelor's degree in three years and a Master's in one. As a result, the costs of obtaining a degree, both in tuition and living costs, are lower than in other parts of the world.

Another big advantage of studying in the UK is that Europe is on the doorstep. This means that students have the opportunity to visit other European countries and experience the wealth of culture available whilst studying at Warwick.

Our campus

Library

Students' Union

Our Students' Union is a democratic organisation run by students for students. It provides a range of services to support the student community at Warwick including societies and sports clubs, academic representation and independent advice and welfare information. Of the 250 societies available students can join societies that match their interests including academic, cultural, music & performance and religious.

Sports Facilities

Our new Sports and Wellness Hub features a range of facilities including gym, swimming pool, fitness classes, climbing wall, squash and badminton courts and a multisports hall. We also have high quality outdoor pitch provision, athletics track and a tennis centre.

Market Day

Each month we host a vibrant mix of stall holders selling mouth-watering street food from around the world and local, fresh produce. Students, staff and the local community are all invited to come and soak up the atmosphere and try something tempting and delicious.

Accommodation

Warwick has a wide range of campus accommodation with something to suit every budget. Students can live in flats, or halls of residence, with kitchens and either en-suite or shared bathroom facilities. Same sex and family accommodation is also available.

All campus bedrooms are furnished to a high standard and have access to free WiFi and/or high speed network access. Our resident tutors are on hand to facilitate harmonious living and pastoral care.

Off campus accommodation can be found in nearby Coventry, Kenilworth and Leamington Spa. All University managed properties have to meet high standards of health, safety and maintenance and cater for a range of budgets. Local Area

Studying at Warwick, means students are a short bus ride away from some of the UK's most well-known, historic and charismatic towns and cities. Aside from Coventry, students can travel from campus to Leamington Spa, Kenilworth, Warwick, Solihull and Stratford-upon-Avon. Birmingham, the UK's second city, is a quick train ride from our nearby train stations in Canley and Tile Hill. Services from those stations, as well as Coventry's main station, also go to London.

Pre-sessional English support

Pre-sessional English is an academic English language and study skills programme.

It prepares postgraduate students linguistically and culturally for their future degree studies and gives them a chance to settle into life in and around the University.

The Pre-Sessional English
Programme is delivered in five
phases and students start the
programme at the English level
that is appropriate for them.
They follow as many phases
as they need to meet the
requirements of their chosen
degree course. The maximum
length of the programme is
forty weeks and the minimum
is six weeks.

Year-round Pre-sessional English Programme - Phases 1, 2 and 3

This starts in October each year. Students can attend up to three different phases covering autumn, spring and summer terms, and then, if they meet the language requirements, go on to either the six or 10 week programme the following summer.

- Phase 1 (autumn) 10 weeks, IELTS 4.5 or PTE 30 minimum
- Phase 2 (spring) 10 weeks, IELTS 5.0 or PTE 40 minimum
- Phase 3 (summer) 10 weeks, IELTS 5.5 or PTE 50 minimum

Year-round Pre-sessional English Programme - Phases 4 and 5

Students do either both phases 4 and 5 (10 weeks) or only phase 5 (6 weeks)

- Phase 4 and 5 10 weeks, IELTS 6.0
- **Phase 5** 6 weeks, IELTS 6.5

Warwick International Foundation Programme

Warwick International Foundation Programme (IFP) is one of the longest running international foundation programmes in the UK.

Studying on the Warwick IFP means students will live and study on the Warwick campus and access the world-class facilities the campus has to offer. The Warwick IFP was established in 1983 and has more than 35 years' experience in supporting students to progress to top UK universities. Students studying on the course will be guaranteed a conditional offer on a range of Warwick undergraduate degree* courses to suit their academic stream. Students also receive intensive English language tuition, tailored to their needs.

There is an IFP community of over 250 students each year from over 40 countries across the world. The IFP team provide a supportive environment helping students to apply and be prepared for their future undergraduate studies.

How to apply

All Warwick undergraduate courses must be applied to through the University and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). Students can submit a maximum of five choices for different courses at the same or different institutions. Further advice can be found at www.ucas.com or warwick.ac.uk/ug/apply

We strongly advise candidates to submit their applications as early as possible, and before 15 January as all applications made before this date must be considered equally. Our UCAS institution code is W20.

Postgraduate Taught

There are approximately 8,200 postgraduate students studying for a Taught Master's course at Warwick, leading to a range of postgraduate degrees.

All our taught courses are carefully structured, developed and delivered by experts in their fields and many of the courses are interdisciplinary.

We have over 140 Postgraduate Taught programmes at Warwick and many of these courses often draw on individual research experience. Students choose Warwick because they want to study in greater depth a subject that has particularly interested them during their first degree. Others want to develop professional skills or study an entirely new subject. Postgraduate Taught courses normally take one year to complete as a full-time student and applications need to be submitted as early as possible as places are limited.

How to apply

Applications for Postgraduate Taught Master's degrees are made directly to the University. To apply to study at Warwick, students should visit warwick.ac.uk/pg/apply

Once the application form has been completed, students can upload supporting documentation including transcripts and English Language proficiency. For students applying from outside the EU, the application deadline is 31 July to ensure that there is enough time to obtain a student visa.

How to apply

Students considering a Postgraduate Research degree at Warwick should first contact a potential supervisor within the proposed area of research. At Warwick, not only do we offer Research degrees across our departments, but we also have over 50 specialist research centres, offering even more choice and specialism for our students.

Once a supervisor has been contacted, and the research proposal finalised, students can then make their application using the same application system as for Postgraduate Taught applications. Students are required to submit the same supporting documentation, as well as their research proposal. 
