

WHO BENEFITS FROM STUDENT VOICE?

Students get to vent and ask questions. Issues, especially WP issues, are fixed slowly. Students with these issues are unlikely to see the changes and improvements they want.

Universities make these improvements which attract positive feedback and more prospective students.
